VARSITY TEAM LEAVES TOMORROW ON EARLY TRAIN

Fifteen Players, Coach, Trainer and Manager Will Make the Trip

FORBES HAS PLENTY OF CONFIDENCE IN TEAM

Last Night's Practice Was Best Yet—Gossip of the Men

Eighteen men leave for Idaho at 6 o'clock in the morning to represent the University next Saturday in what may be the most crucial game of the football season. The men who go are Means, centre; Gillis and Pinkham, guards; Main and Moulten, tackles; Michael and Kiltz, ends; Hayes and McKinley, halfbacks; Clarke, full-back; Hurd, Sweek and Dodson, substitutes. The fourth substitute will be either Latourette or McIntyre. Last night Latourette wrenched his knee, with the result that he may not be able to play. In case he does not go McIntyre will be taken.

Coch Forbes stated today that the team was in excellent shape. Latourette is the only man out of the game. Forbes has plenty of confidence in his men.

The team will be escorted to the train by a bunch of rooters. It will stay in Portland tomorrow afternoon, practicing on the Multnomah field. The next morning it will arrive in Colfax to breakfast, from where it will go to Moscow.

In the practice last night the offensive work of the team showed great improvement. When the first team took the ball some heavy smashing plays were pulled off in such rapid succession that the "varsity roots" were brought to their feet.

Behind the line the work of McKinley and McIntyre was especially noticeable. McIntyre is new to the backfield position but his 185 pounds showed up in the rushes with more yards through the second team than any other combination has brought in previous practices.

Main at left tackle is very steady, and not a single buck of any distance has been made through him yet. Moulten and Kiltz on the end runs around their side easily tore up the second team interference. Moulten makes a point in getting out far and wide, and while he lets an occasional buck through for some distance it is rare that a sweeping run gets around his territory.

Clarke is still able to punt his customary distance. One try in the Willamette game netted seventy yards. Place kicking is not yet as accurate as in the days of Bezdek. The latter worked Moulten for an hour each night until there was almost no uncertainty.

READY TO TURN WATER PLANT OVER TO THE CITY

A. Welch, at the head of the Willamette Valley, was in the city today on business connected with the company's various enterprises here. He stated to a reporter that his company, now that the supreme court had declared the city's water bonds to be valid, is ready to turn the water plant over to the city as soon as the latter is ready. He said the company has been ready to make the transfer for a long time past, but was waiting of course until the friendly suit to determine the legality of the bonds was settled.
