**DAVID B. HILL
DECLARES FOR BRYAN
IN A PUBLIC SPEECH**

Albany, N. Y., Oct. 28.—The feature of W. J. Bryan's tour up-state today was the appearance on the platform here of ex-United States Senator David B. Hill. It was the first time in several years that Mr. Hill has attended such a gathering, so, when he stepped forward as chairman to introduce Democracy's leader, the great crowd that packed the hall where the meeting was held, rose to a man and cheered enthusiastically.

"Although not connected with politics," Mr. Hill said, "I reiterate that I am heartily in favor of the Democratic state and National tickets. I am not so partisan, however, that I would support the party, whether right or wrong, but permit me to say that I support the National ticket in this campaign because in my judgment the presidential candidate, who honors us with his presence here tonight, is absolutely right upon every contested question in this campaign. It is time for a change in the administration of the government, a change in measures and men. Our candidate owes his nomination not to any one man or set of men, but only to the people themselves. If elected, he will be president himself and not a dummy for any man. He will not be led around with a string like a great, caged bear."

Calls Bryan His Friend
Mr. Hill, referring to the Republican charge that a panic would follow Mr. Bryan's election, declared that it would not be a business panic, "but it would be a panic on the part of hundreds of thousands of federal office holders and public officials who will have to surrender their places to the victorious party."

**McARTHUR MAY BE
SPEAKER OF HOUSE**

That C. N. McArthur, representative from Multnomah county and candidate for speakership in the house, is confident of his prospects is indicated by the following statement made yesterday by Mr. McArthur in the course of an interview at the Willamette hotel:

"As far as the speakership is concerned, I will say that I have paid little or no attention to it during the presidential campaign. I shall, however, devote some time to my candidacy after the national election is over. From the numerous assurances of support that have been coming to me, I feel warranted in stating that my prospects for election to the speakership are first class."
