### OREGON ELECTION LAWS STRINGENT AND MUST BE OBSERVED

It is unlawful on election day—  
 To hire vehicles to haul voters to and from the polls;  
 To hire anyone to work at the polls except to challenge persons not qualified to vote;  
 To wear any political badge or insignia at the polls;  
 To distribute cards or campaign literature at the polls; or to work at the polls in any way to influence the voters;  
 To do anything to influence voters.  
 Under the terms of Oregon's new corrupt practice act, passed by the people in June, the Presidential election November 3 will be just a plain election, without any frills—nothing but the polls, the election board and the voters. The time honored gauntlet of political workers handing out cards, which the voter has always had to run, is now illegal. The reluctant voter who has waited for his party enthusiasts to hunt him out and take him to the polls in a carriage or hack must walk, pay car fare or stay away. No person is permitted to use any effort, at the polls or away from them, on election day, to influence the voting of any one. Some sections of the corrupt practices act relating to election day follow:  
 "It shall be unlawful for any person to pay another for any loss or damage due to attendance at the polls, or in registering, or for the expense of transportation to or from the polls.  
 "No person shall pay for personal service to be performed on the day of any election, for any purpose connected therewith, except for the hiring of persons whose sole duty is to act as challengers, and watch the count of official ballots.  
 "No person shall buy, sell or give or provide any political badge, button or insignia to be worn at or about the polls on the day of any election, and no such political badge, button or other insignia shall be worn at or about the polls on any election day.  
 "It shall be unlawful for any person at any place on the day of any election to ask, solicit or in any manner try to induce or persuade any voter on such election day to vote for or refrain from voting for any candidate or the candidates or ticket of any political party or organization."

**NEW BILL OF LADING IN OPERATION**

Chicago, Ill., Oct. 31.—The uniform bill of lading, which has been under discussion by leading associations of business men, shippers and others for the past three years, and which during that time has been carefully considered by the railroads, will be put into operation the first of

### the week by all of the 416 roads in the official classification territory, extending west to the Mississippi and south to the Ohio.

The terms of the new bill of lading determine the carrier's responsibility to the shipper in case of damage or loss. It is the belief of the railroads that this will greatly lessen the friction between the carriers and shippers in respect to claims for damages to freight. How important this item is appears from the fact that in 1907 the seventeen principal roads in the trunk line territory paid out a total of \$5,596,794 for loss and damage claims.  
 In order to enforce the use of the new form of bill of lading, the railroads will make the acceptance of the new form a condition of accepting freight at published rates. A provision has been agreed upon whereby shippers having a supply of the old forms on hand may use them until December 1 providing the new regulations are stamped thereon.

### KING GEORGE HAS RULED GREECE FOR FIFTY-FIVE YEARS

Athens, Oct. 31.—Many congratulations have been received by George I in recognition of the fact that today he rounded out forty-five years as King of Greece. Born a Danish prince, son of the late King Christian IX., his Majesty spent his early years in the Danish navy. The National Assembly proclaimed him King of the Hellenes on March 30, 1863. He was then seventeen years old, having been born on December 24, 1845. On October 30 of the same year he arrived in Athens and on the following day he took the oath and mounted the throne.  
 Next to the Emperor of Austria he is the oldest of the sovereigns of Europe. He enjoys excellent health, a fact which he ascribes to the regularity of his habits. He invariably rises early in the morning and walks alone. At 9:30 he takes tea and coffee with Queen Olga. He then receives his ministers, and deputies, and the persons entered on the visiting book for a private audience. At 1:30 he breakfasts with all the royal family. After this repast he again works for an hour or two. He then goes out for a drive or a walk. Dinner is served at 8 o'clock and the company comprises the members of the royal family, the dignitaries of the palace and some private friends. The King goes out very rarely at night, unless it be to the theater or to the fetes given by the representatives of foreign powers. He prefers to pass the evening with his family.

### NEW LINER GEORGE WASHINGTON LAUNCHED

Bremen, Oct. 31.—The North German Lloyd Company's new steamship George Washington was successfully launched today in the presence of the largest crowd that ever witnessed an event of the kind at the local shipyards. The American ambassador, David Jayne Hill, officiated at the christening ceremonies and afterwards delivered an address at the luncheon given by the North German Lloyd officials.  
 The George Washington has the distinction of being the largest German steamship ever built. She is 77 feet long and her tonnage will be 27,000. She will be the first of the North German Lloyd liners with a provision for an additional third-class to accommodate those passengers of small means who find the price of second-cabin accommodations too high, and yet who do not wish to travel in the steerage.
