Tomorrow morning will be held the student hour during the assembly period. Alumni will address the students, after which lessons in yelling will be given preparatory to the Corvallis excursion.

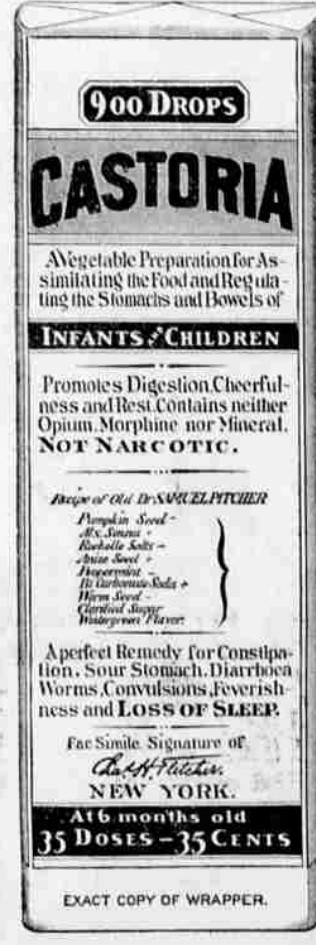
Colored Quarter.
