LANE COUNTY GOES FOR TAFT

Majority Will Reach Thirteen Hundred

With the count complete in 20 out of 50 precincts in Lane county the total vote stands Taft, 2758; Bryan, 1,554, or a majority for Taft of 1198.

The 20 precincts not yet in have registered 850 voters in the two big parties, which probably means a majority of 1300 for the Republican ticket in Lane county.

All the precincts in the county went for Taft except Junction City, Cheshier, Spencer, Lost Valley and Jasper. Junction City gave Bryan 14 majority, Cheshier 9, Spencer 16, Lost Valley 7 and Jasper 7.

In Eugene 1612 votes were divided between Taft and Bryan as follows: Eugene North No. 1—Taft, 233; Bryan, 132. North No. 2—Taft, 246; Bryan, 118. South No. 1—Taft, 229; Bryan, 123. South No. 2—Taft, 235; Bryan, 130. Fairmount—Taft, 117; Bryan 81.

Late Returns Chicago (2 a.m.)—957 out of 2611 precincts in Illinois outside of Cook county give Deneen, 144,636; Stevenson, 120,757.

Detroit—176 out of 2013 precincts give Taft 90,532; Bryan, 37,225. For governor—Warner (Rep.), 36,475; Homan (Dem.), 37,549.

Fargo, N. D.—83 precincts in the state give Taft, 3100; Bryan, 1363.

Wyoming Republican Cheyenne (1 a.m.)—On the face of the incomplete returns the Republicans appear to have carried the state by 5000.

Washington Returns Spokane, Nov. 3.—Early returns from Spokane indicate that the county has gone for Taft by about 3000. Eighteen precincts in King county give Taft 2300; Bryan 1652.

In Gem State Pocatello, Idaho—Six precincts in Dannock county give Brady, Republican, for governor, 260 majority.

Colorado Doubtful Denver, Colo.—Returns are slow, but give Taft a small plurality. Both parties claim the state.

Rhode Island 1600 Providence, R. I.—At midnight with about two-thirds of the 161 precincts heard from the figures indicate a probable plurality of 1600 for Taft in the state.

SECOND DEGREE MURDER IN JAHN VERDICT

Everett, Nov. 3.—Murder in the second degree was the verdict in the case of J. H. Jahn, who killed Jesse Price at Darrington last March. Jahn alleged insanity as the result of persecutions at the hands of Price and family at Pittsburg, Ohio.
