Austin, Texas, Nov. 6.—The Attorney General's office hopes the report will prove true that Henry Clay Pierce, chairman of the Waters-Pierce Oil Company, will voluntarily come to Texas next week to stand trial on the long-pending indictment against him.

The troubles between the State of Texas and the Waters-Pierce Oil Company date back nearly a decade, but the charge against H. Clay Pierce, on which he is to be placed on trial dates back to two years ago this month. It was in November, 1906, that the Travis county grand jury returned an indictment against Mr. Pierce charging him with false swearing.

The vigorous fight made by Mr. Pierce to prevent extradition to this state to stand trial is familiar to all newspaper readers. His last recourse was exhausted two weeks ago when the Supreme Court of the United States denied his motion for a rehearing and sustained the lower court's decision that Mr. Pierce must stand trial before the Texas courts.
