SALEM CLEARLY OUTPLAYED EUGENE IN SATURDAY'S GAME

Local Football Team Seemed to Lack the Spirit that Has Characterized it in Other Contests

Saturday at Salem the Eugene high school met its first football defeat for the year when its team played that of Salem. The Eugene team in the first half was clearly outplayed, the half being played wholly in Eugene's territory. Once or twice the Eugene boys seemed to rally, but not once in this half did they have an opportunity to score. The local team lacked the snap and vim which they have shown in previous games. Their attacks would seem to melt as they hit their opponent's line.

In the second half, however, the Eugene boys seemed to rally and once they worked, by successive end runs by Preston and Bailey, to the five-yard line. Here they lost the ball on yardage, and Salem immediately punted out of danger. This was the only time Salem's goal was endangered.

Throughout the game Eugene's punting was exceptionally good. Salem worked the forward pass to advantage several times. Eugene, as a whole, lost by that play. There were several raw decisions on the part of the referee, but as a whole the game was especially clean. Salem's star was Parsons, who repeatedly made yardage by end runs. Kreiger played as consistent a game as any one for Eugene. The field was soft and slippery.

It was admitted by Salem that Eugene had more of her students on the field than their own school. The Eugene rooters showed the result of their training and yelled consistently. Salem's yelling was done almost wholly by the girls, and showed no training whatever. After the game Eugene's rooters showed themselves grand losers by forming a big serpentine, marching down the main street and giving their own and Salem's yells. The behavior of the Eugene students while in Salem created favorable comment.

After the game a reception fitted to the limited time Eugene had in the evening was tendered to the visitors. The Salem students tried to show their guests a good time. The rowdiness shown at one time was only on the part of a few Salem toughs and very much regretted by the students as a whole.

Owing to a misunderstanding as to where to get on their own cars about twenty of the Eugene rooters were left in Salem Saturday evening. They took the early morning train home.

DECLARES STEVENSON WAS ELECTED GOVERNOR

Chicago, Nov. 9.—Declaring that if the truth were known Adlai E. Stevenson, former vice president of the United States and a Democrat, was elected governor of Illinois on Tuesday instead of Governor Deneen, Republican, the incumbent, the Democrats are preparing to contest Deneen's election. They will demand that every ballot cast for governor be recounted. Charles Boeschstein, chairman of the Democratic central committee, says he is reasonably certain that a careful count will show Stevenson was elected.

KING EDWARD'S BIRTHDAY OBSERVED

London, Nov. 9.—King Edward's 67th birthday was observed today with the firing of military salutes, the ringing of bells and the flying of flags throughout the United Kingdom and other parts of the British empire. In the telegrams of congratulation received at Sandringham during the day all the crowned heads of Europe, President Fallieres, of the French Republic, President Roosevelt and the numerous ambassadors of Great Britain to foreign powers were represented. The king is reported to be in excellent health.
