### NEW YORK'S ANNUAL HORSE SHOW OPENS

New York, Nov. 9.—The annual period when New York society pays its tribute to the fancy bred horse, had its beginning auspiciously when the twenty-fourth National Horse Show opened in Madison Square Garden today. The big show will last through the week.  
In spite of the great and increasing vogue of the automobile, the entry list of the horse show this year has not suffered in point of numbers. The number of new exhibitors is unusually large. Canada is represented with a large string, while a number of foreign horses are to be seen for the first time.  
The most notable increase in the entries is in the thoroughbred classes, three times as many stallions as last year being entered. The classes for ladies' saddle horses show a remarkable increase in number of entries, showing that riding is growing more popular among women. Two classes have been added this year, and all—the old and the new—have filled well.  
The greatest loss is in the breeding classes, which for the last five years have been slowly dwindling in size. They are so small this year that unless a greater interest is shown before next season these classes will be eliminated and more popular ones established.  
Following the lead of the International horse show, at the London Olympiad, the managers of the present exhibition have transformed the arena of Madison Square Garden into an elaborately decorated setting for the display of fine horses and fashions. To the somewhat sombre orange and black of former years have been added flags and bunting, flowers and growing plants and a flood of artificial light effects.  
Another new feature of the show is an exhibition of antique carriages and equipment for the horse. The country and historic vehicles of olden times, and some notable exhibits have been made. Among them are the carriages of Washington, Lafayette and Lincoln, and many old and curious vehicles of the Colonial period.
