COLLEGIATE WRESTLING IS BEING CONSIDERED

O. A. C. Is Taking the Lead in the Movement Among Northwest Colleges.

Wrestling will become one of the main intercollegiate forms of competition this winter and in succeeding years, if the plans of Edgar Frank, president of the P. N. A. and chairman of indoor athletics at the Multnomah club, are carried out, says the telegram. Mr. Frank is the best amateur wrestler in the Northwest, and has held the 135-pound championship of the coast for three years. He has made the sport popular in Portland, and last week he wrote to the six conference colleges offering to assist them in every way if they wished to take up the sport. He received replies from O. A. C., W. S. C. and Oregon this morning and each is favorable to the proposition, although no official action has been taken in the matter. Professor Angel says that O. A. C. will take the matter right up and invite Oregon, Whitman, Washington, Idaho and W. S. C. to form a wrestling league. The college wrestling season comes at the close of football and lasts until baseball. The football men then can go into wrestling or basketball. Trainer Hayward understands the wrestling game very well. In case a league or meet of some kind is formed, he would probably train the Oregon men. There is very good material here.

U. S. EXAMINATIONS FOR PHILIPPINE SERVICE

Examinations Will Be Held Here on December 28 and 29

The United States Civil Service Commission announces an examination on December 29-30, 1936, in this city to fill a large number of vacancies in the positions of clerk and teacher in the Philippine Service. Further details may be learned at the postoffice. The entrance salary of the majority of male appointees will be \$1200 per annum, although some appointments may be made at salaries of \$1000 or \$1100, based upon the experience and the relative standing in the examination, and they will be eligible for promotion up to \$2,000 per annum for teachers. Eligibility in the assistant examination is required for promotion to the positions of division superintendent, which carry salaries ranging from \$1800 to \$3000. Women will not be admitted to the teacher examination unless they are the wives, immediate relatives, or fiancées of men examined for teacher or assistant or appointed to or already employed in the Philippine Service as teacher. Each woman applicant should state definitely in her application the name, address and relationship of such person. Only a small proportion of appointments can be made from the female teacher register, and such appointees usually receive entrance salaries of \$1000 or \$900. It is desired to secure as many eligibles as possible who are college graduates, and especially of normal schools. Persons with training and experience in industrial work and in agriculture are desired, and preference in appointment will be given them. The Philippine school year begins in the early part of June and ends with the month of March. So far as possible all appointments of teachers are made with a view to their arrival at Manila before the beginning of May. In this way the contract period of two years expires with the school year. Later sailings are sometimes permitted, but few appointments are made during the remainder of the year.

There are at present 960 students in the Oregon Agricultural College, classified by courses of study as follows:

Agriculture, 167; Forestry, 22; Domestic Science and Art, 164; Civil Engineering, 114; Electrical Engineering, 133; Mining Engineering, 50; Commerce, 122; Pharmacy, 88; Music, 39.

About 30 per cent of the students are self-supporting. Many of the students are heads of families. About fifty per cent of the students are partly self-supporting.

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


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
