### HARRIMAN AND HILL FIGHT FOR PACIFIC COAST

San Francisco, Cal., Nov. 12.—Financiers here say E. H. Harriman and James J. Hill, the two greatest railroad magnates in the world, are preparing to lock horns in a battle for the control of transportation in the west and on the Pacific coast. Followers of railroad construction say today that the battle beginning in the Northwest will be fought all along the coast to San Francisco. It is pointed out that the activity of Hill in the Spokane, Portland & Seattle road and in the various electric feeders to his road in the Northwest is to forestall any attempt at development by Harriman that may take away from the Hill roads the valuable traffic of that section of the country. Harriman has been strengthening himself in Oregon and California by electrifying his lines and by building new ones, but Hill is expected to show his hand soon, when the new road from San Francisco to Oregon via Tibourn is opened. The proposed road from Tibourn to Portland is supposed to be backed by Hill. Rights of way have been secured by the Hoteling interests and the road will connect with San Francisco via Tibourn and run to Vallejo and the Sacramento river islands, thence to Portland by the Pacific, Napa Valley & Eureka.

### RAILROAD PREPARES FOR BIG INFUX

Butte, Mont., Nov. 13.—That the Northern Pacific expects the travel into the Northwest next year to exceed that of any previous year is indicated by the statement of President Elliott today that the company has ordered 93 new passenger coaches, which will be placed in the transcontinental service next year. An increase in the service throughout the Northwest will be made.

### MAN WITH FIFTY CHILDREN UNABLE TO SUPPORT THEM

Taunton, Mass., Nov. 13.—Clement Cunha, 63 years old and father of 50 living children, was sentenced to the workhouse for a year yesterday on a charge of non-support and neglect of his four-day-old twins. Cunha two days ago reported to the authorities that a woman and her new-born twins were starving. An investigation showed Cunha was the woman's husband and he was arrested. On the witness stand he admitted he had a divorced wife living in New Bedford to whom he had been married eleven years. During that time she had given birth to five sets of twins, two sets of triplets and two odd sons, 18 children. Another divorced wife, who is now in Portugal, is the mother of all his other children except the set of twins born to his present wife and a daughter who preceded them. "How many children, all told, have you?" asked the judge.

### GARDINER PASTOR FREED ON BONDS

Roseburg, Nov. 13.—Rev. George C. Clark, alleged to be the Rev. Mr. Summers, indicted at Throckmorton, Texas, in 1904 on the charge of obtaining money under false pretenses, and arrested at Gardiner, this county, last week, was arraigned before the local justice of the peace last evening and placed under bonds of \$500, which were furnished by two Roseburg business men. Next Wednesday was the date set for his examination, the purpose of which is to enable Governor Chamberlain to let intelligently on the requisition for the minister's extradition to Texas. This requisition is in the hands of an officer now enroute from Texas to Salem. Last evening the local authorities telegraphed to Throckmorton for a person, whose identity is not revealed, to come to Roseburg and see if the accused man is Summers. This person will arrive here in time for the examination next week.

### FEAR OF BUSINESS DEPRESSION CAUSE OF BRYAN'S DEFEAT

"Fear of business depression and hope of an early revival of commerce is the only cause of Taft's election," states Mayor J. F. Reddy, who has recently returned from New York and other Eastern cities. "I hadn't been in New York but a few hours when I saw how things were going. It wasn't that the people preferred Taft to Bryan. The latter was the popular favorite but it was the talk made by the employers to the employees of probable shut-down, the old bread and butter coercion, that swung the votes in line for Taft. No one wanted to take a chance, and the majority believed that Bryan's election might postpone the business revival for six months, while Taft's would hasten it. "But the people were wild for Bryan. In Chicago the Saturday evening before election 25,000 people waited until 1 o'clock in the morning to hear him, and then it was Sunday and he wouldn't make a political speech. He was due at 8 o'clock and the railroads convention postponed him without any cause whatever. The one enquiry made by the Chicago papers showed the railroads had no valid excuse for the delay."—Medford Tribune.

### RAYMOND HITCHCOCK THE ACTOR MAY NEVER BE TRIED

New York, Nov. 13.—Raymond Hitchcock, the comedian, will probably never be tried on the two indictments as the result of the charge preferred by three young girls. District Attorney Jerome announced in court today that there is no hope of conviction and upon his recommendation his bail of \$7500 was discharged. It is likely that Hitchcock's attorneys in a few days will move the dismissal of the indictments. Hitchcock has been acquitted on two indictments.
