MUCH MORE
PAVING ORDERED
BY COUNCIL
Elven Blocks of Bitulithic Ordered at Last Night's Meeting of the City Dads
At a meeting of the city council last night eleven more blocks of street paving were ordered and ordinances covering the work will be prepared for passage. The streets to be paved under this new order are as follows: Pearl street from East Sixth to East Eleventh, five blocks; Olive street from West Tenth to West Eleventh, one block; West Eleventh street from Olive to Lincoln, two blocks; Oak street from East Ninth to East Eleventh, two blocks; East Tenth street from Willamette to Oak, one block. After these contracts are completed the city will have over 70 blocks of bitulithic pavement. Other Matters. Some supplies for the water pumping plant were ordered from the Berger-Bean Hardware Co. The contract with Frank C. Kelsey of Portland for constructing an engine of the power plant and the transmission line at 2 per cent of the cost of construction, payable at the rate of \$250 for each month, before the 19th as the work progresses, was read, and it was referred to the mayor and city attorney to adjust it as they might think right for the city. The matter of diseased meat and milk being peddled in the city was discussed but no action taken. The matter of a waiting station on the street railway line at the corner of East Thirteenth and Alder streets was referred to the street committee with power to act. The contract for establishing a rock crushing plant by Sam Manerod was favorably reported on, and the street committee was instructed to enter into contract after investigating the matter. The matter to extend the city water mains to Hill Crest addition which was rejected at the last meeting of the council was reconsidered. The motion was carried out of order and the mayor stated that the order and the mayor's jurisdiction of the matter was within the jurisdiction of the water commission. WELCH SYSTEM
MAY BE PACIFIC
COAST LINE
Chehalis, Wash., Nov. 18.—W. J. Pattison and A. Welch have applied for a franchise to operate a street railroad through certain streets of this city. They ask for a fifty-year franchise and agree to begin work on the line within six months after it has been granted. After the sixth year they are to pay the city \$250 per year for twenty years; for the remainder of the life of the franchise, \$500 a year. It is stated that the securing of the franchise here is but a part of a plan to link up the Pacific Northwest with an electric system. It is said to be the intention of the company to continue south toward Portland as fast as the right of way can be secured. The same men who are applying for a franchise have made application to the city of Centralia the purpose being to connect the two cities, which are only four miles apart. CALL FOR CITY WARRANTS.
