

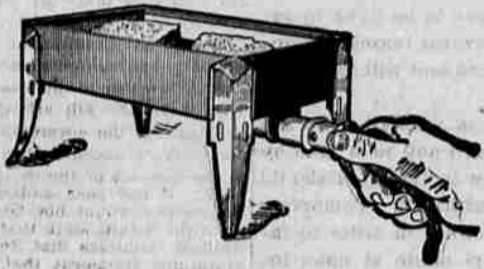

### COLLEGE GIRLS WISH TO ESTABLISH DEBATE LEAGUE

Movement Started At Albany—Has Been Discussed At University

An effort to organize a state debating league for young women students of the various colleges and universities in Oregon was set on foot last week when the young women of Albany College met and elected Miss Rhoda Stalnaker as manager of the local young women's debating society.

In pursuance of the plan to organize a state debating league, Miss Stalnaker will write at once to the several state institutions and endeavor to ascertain the sentiment toward a state league, and if favorable, will later set a time for a meeting, at which the colleges and universities will be represented, to permanently perfect the league.

Talk of such an organization has been indulged in by the student body of the University students. Two or three girls may enter the fray for the interstate teams this year, and in case a girls' team is formed their attention will probably be directed to forensic contests with girls' teams.

The opinion is generally held that mixed teams tend toward biased decisions, for usually the judges have a prejudice in favor of girls. Tradition has decreed that Oregon debaters shall be men, and such is the rule in other colleges in the Northwest.

New York, Nov. 21.—The World today prints the purported substance of an alleged interview between Dr. William Bayard Hale and Emperor William in which the emperor severely criticizes Great Britain and other countries. Today Dr. Hale announced the story as a fabrication and states that he told the World reporter, who showed the story to him before publication, that it was a fabrication from beginning to end.
