The Guard understands that the successful bidders expect to begin work on the foundation for the building at once, as it will be necessary to rush construction in order to have everything completed in a year's time.

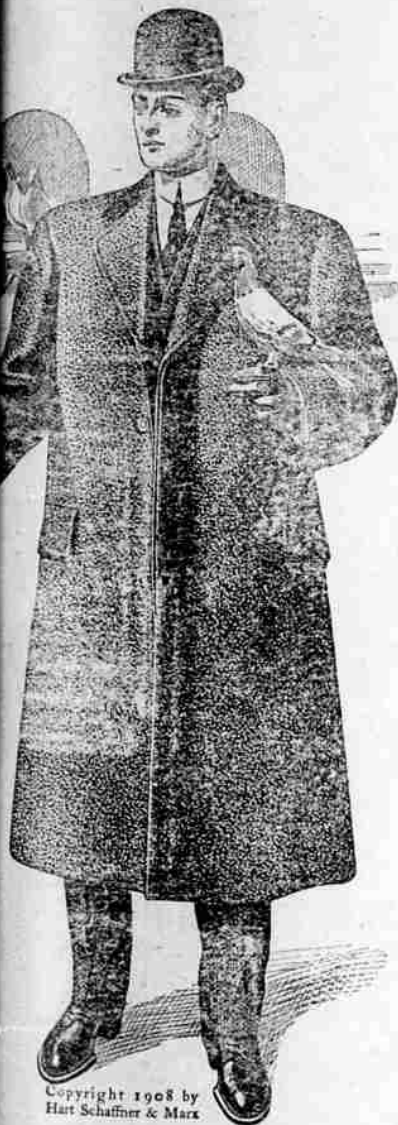
