ATWOODS FAIL TO BLOCK CASE

Judge Gantenbein Overrules Demurrer of Tremont Hospital's Owners

Presiding Judge Gantenbein in the circuit court this morning overruled the demurrer to the indictment against Drs. C. H. Atwood and C. H. T. Atwood, who are charged with committing acts outraging public decency in equipping and conducting the maternity hospital at Tremont station. The chief ground of demurrer was that more than one offense was charged in one indictment.

In disposing of this point Judge Gantenbein cited his ruling in the case against Mrs. Belle Waymire and E. E. Radding, who were convicted of a conspiracy to blacken the reputation of Mayor Lane. In that case the defense urged that more than one crime was charged, as the commission of a crime, the breaking of a door, was alleged in connection with the main crime.

Judge Gantenbein's ruling in the Waymire-Radding case was upheld by the supreme court, which held that the breaking of the door was only incidental to the offense charged. The court applied the same rule to the Atwood case, in which the alleged performing of a criminal operation forms an incidental part.

AGE OF SHEEP SHOWN BY TEETH

The age of sheep is very easily shown by an examination of the teeth, said a sheep man recently. A lamb has the first pair of permanent front teeth when about ten months old; the second pair appears at about 18 months; the third pair at about 23 months and the fourth at about 33 to 40 months. When the whole of the permanent front teeth have appeared, the sheep is in its fourth year.

The Merino matures the teeth earlier than the other breeds; the Cotswold and Southdowns and other highly improved mutton sheep are some months ahead of a Merino, but at 4 years every sheep has its full mouth of teeth. Later the age is known by the appearance of the teeth, which gradually lose their sharp edges.

A healthy sheep will keep its teeth good until 10 or 12 years old, if the pasture is not unusually bare and the soil sandy, so as to wear the teeth excessively.

SEVERE ARRAIGNMENT OF PAPER TRUST

Washington, Nov. 22.—A severe arraignment of the so-called "Paper Trust" was the feature of today's tariff hearing before the House committee on ways and means, which was in session until nearly midnight. After hearing arguments mainly for a protective tariff, which occupied their attention until after 5 o'clock the committee listened to testimony of John Norris, representing the American Newspaper Publishers' Association.

Tariff Bed Feature.
Mr. Norris argued for free trade in pulp and print paper, giving many figures to show that the protection afforded the paper manufacturers by the present tariff resulted in unreasonable prices.

Reports of the typographical engravers, pressman's and stereotypers' and electrotypers' unions supported Mr. Norris' contentions with the additional argument that the increased cost of paper reduced the size of newspapers and gave less work and lower wages.

The paper manufacturers occupied the rest of the time and were sharply questioned by Democratic members. Arthur J. Hastings of New York, president of the American Paper and Pulp Association, admitted that dividends as high as 24 per cent had been paid by the Cliff Paper Company of Niagara, of which he is the head, in addition to which the company had earned in 20 years \$400,000 on a capital of \$100,000.

Chester W. Lyman, assistant to the president of the International Paper Company, the so-called "Paper Trust," read a statement, giving detailed information regarding the company.

Trust Perfectly Contented.
"We are opposed to any reduction whatever in the duties specified for pulp," said Mr. Lyman. "We are most emphatically opposed to any reduction in the print paper insofar as it applies to newspapers. So far as this company is concerned, it is content to leave the tariff as it is, with the exception of countervailing clause and a possible addition to the administrative acts of the tariff law which will prevent foreign manufacturers selling their output in this country at lower prices than prevail in their home markets."
