JUBILEE DAY FOR TEXAS UNIVERSITY

Austin, Texas, Nov. 25.—This is jubilee day at the University of Texas, and the ceremonies are commemorative of the founding of the institution and the work it has accomplished during its twenty-five years of existence. Several thousand graduates and other friends of the university have assembled from all parts of Texas and from other states to take part in the celebration.
The feature of the celebration was the anniversary exercises this forenoon. The addresses were made by members of the faculty and distinguished visitors from various parts of the country. The principal speakers were Professor George P. Garrison and President Sidney E. Mezes. The speakers highly praised the work of the university in the past and present and predicted a bright future for it. When the university first opened there were 100 students. Now there are more than 1500.
This afternoon the alumni and other visitors were treated to an old-fashioned barbecue. Tomorrow will come the dedication of the new law building in honor of Oran M. Roberts and Judge Robert S. Gould. The speakers at the dedication exercises will be Judge Yancey Lewis and Professor Williston, of the Harvard Law School.

EVACUATION DAY IS OBSERVED IN NEW YORK

New York, Nov. 25.—Flags were displayed on the city hall and other public buildings today in observance of the anniversary of the evacuation of New York by the British troops in 1783. Although only a local anniversary day, not celebrated outside of New York, the occasion is publicly commemorated in a number of ways. The famous Old Guard never fails to parade down Broadway and there are flag poles at the Battery and at old Fort Clinton in Central Park.

ANDREW CARNEGIE SEVENTY-ONE YEARS OLD

New York, Nov. 25.—Andrew Carnegie, who has earned for himself the title of the world's most noted philanthropist-capitalist, was seventy-one years old today. Thanks to his simple life and regular habits, Mr. Carnegie is in the enjoyment of excellent health. Despite the whiteness of his hair and beard he might easily be taken for a man of sixty years or even younger. His devotion to golf and other forms of outdoor recreation has kept him in the best of physical condition.

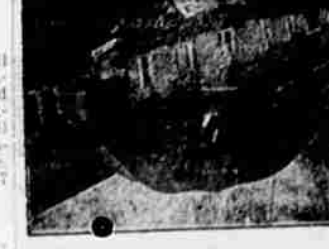
It is estimated that Mr. Carnegie's public benefactions in 1908 amount to about \$15,000,000. Since he made up his mind that it is not good to die rich he has given away a total of about \$150,000,000 of his colossal fortune and he declares he is still ready to give. Notwithstanding the generous hand with which he has scattered his millions for the benefit of the people on both sides of the Atlantic, there appears to be no chance of Mr. Carnegie dying poor. His income is estimated to be considerably in excess of his benefactions, though the latter average more than \$1,000,000 a month the year round.
