### WILL O. A. C.— OREGON GAME BE ON CAMPUS

Alumni Wish It Played in Portland—Violation of College Spirit

Because Portland people and Corvallis football enthusiasts demand that the Oregon-O. A. C. game be played in Portland each year, the athletic council will have one of the hardest questions to decide that has come before it in years. The prevailing opinion at the University is that the game should be made a campus affair, and that the spirit should enter college athletics that pervades the great Eastern institutions. No collegiate contests should be played on other fields than those of the campus of one of the contestants.

The fact that the contest last Saturday was so successful financially adds greater pressure on the council. It appears not unlikely that the final decision will rest with the faculty.

The graduate manager, C. N. McArthur, is known to favor the move of making the annual game between Oregon and O. A. C. in Portland a permanent feature of the schedule. Other members of the alumni, many of whom are residents of Portland, also back him in his demand. For them it adds greatly to the convenience of attending.

The students do not like the idea mainly for the reason that it makes the expense greater, so that many of them will not be able to attend throughout their college career the biggest game of the season.

Some of the faculty do not like the proposed change, because it makes University athletics appear commercialized. The actions of college rooters, they also claim, will not be under their command, and are likely to lose their college flavor.

When the contracts were drawn for the game in Portland which was played last Saturday, it was verbally agreed that the precedent should not bind for the coming season. Oregon gave in to the request of O. A. C. because she was defeated last year, and therefore did not feel that she had the right to oppose the stipulations of the Corvallis management.

By the general understanding among the Oregon students, in case the game is brought back to the campus it will be played here next year. However, in order to get the O. A. C. manager to consent to bring it back to the campuses of the institutions, it might be found necessary

to play the contest of next year in Corvallis.

Ogden, Utah, Nov. 25.—While a large audience was enjoying a musical comedy at the Grand opera house last night Walter Luckey, a young man, blew out his brains with a rifle in the foyer of the theatre.

Luckey, who was 30 years of age, stood at the theatre entrance with a Winchester rifle. Just before the audience emerged from the building he put the muzzle of the weapon to his mouth and pulled the trigger by means of a string.

The sound of the shot was not heard above the laughter of the audience, and attaches of the theatre removed the body before the doors were thrown open.

Luckey is known to have lost money and is thought to have been dependent.

Walter Luckey formerly lived in Eugene, being a son of Eugene Luckey, who mysteriously disappeared from his home here a good many years ago. Walter was a brother of Miss Pearl Luckey, a well-known graduate of the University and a teacher in the Eugene high school last year. Tad Luckey, also formerly of Eugene, now in the liquor business in Portland, is a brother. Mrs. Mary L. Butler, of Portland, is his mother.
