ONLY FEW HIGH SCHOOL BOYS USE CIGARETTES

HEAVY BUSINESS FAILURE OF COBURG MAN

J. J. Henderson Has Liabilities of \$17,000, and Assets of Only \$5000

J. J. Henderson, of Coburg, made an assignment today of all his property to W. E. Allingham for the benefit of all his creditors pro rata. His liabilities are about \$17,000, and assets \$5000. Geo. B. Dorris, of this city, is attorney for the principal creditors.

Mr. Henderson sold out his property at McMinnville some six years ago for \$25,000, and moved to Coburg, where he has apparently been unsuccessful in business operations, running heavily in debt, several banks being large creditors. At the present time he is a very sick man and practically unable to look after his business affairs, hence the assignment.
