Caryl Wilmer sailed for England last week, having completed his highly successful vaudeville engagement in this country. He won considerable distinction and made many friends. He is booked to appear in London next Monday.

Charles Wayne and Miss Gertrude Des Roche, both of whom formerly were quite well known in comic opera, have returned to their old love, vaudeville, and are appearing together in a comedy playlet, entitled "The Morning After."

Manager Sidney R. Ellis has secured a plot of ground on Broadway, New York, on which he proposes to build a theatre, which is to be the home of his star, Al. H. Wilson. It will be called the Wilson and will cost about \$280,000.

LABOR NOTES

The International Brotherhood of Maintenance of Ways employees will hold its seventh biennial convention in New Orleans next Monday.

The next biennial session of the grand division of the Order of Railway Conductors of America will be held in Boston in May of next year.

In Austria and France the provision of rescue apparatus in mines is made compulsory. In Germany it is optional, but has been voluntarily adopted.

Farm laborers in the South, paid by the month or year, and fed and supported by the land owner, receive 35 to 40 cents a day during the working season.

Spinners and card room workers in Manchester, England, have adjusted their differences with the manufacturers, agreeing temporarily to accept a five per cent reduction.

The last available statistics show that in one year in Germany the sum of about \$30,000,000 was paid to invalid workmen to the number of \$71,000, in the form of old age pensions.

The Bakers' union of Memphis, Tenn., has started a label campaign which, the members hope, will produce good results. The idea is to place a value upon the bread labels and thus encourage their use.

The Luxembourg government is treating incorrigible vagabonds to bread and water for the first four days of their imprisonment, and to the lowest scale of ordinary diet twice a week afterward. The prisons are said to be emptying fast.

What is said to have been the first time in the history of Westmoreland, Pa., in the coal region, religious services were conducted underground recently. The miners listened eagerly to the prayers and joined in the chorus of revival hymns.

The annual conference of the Miners' Federation of Great Britain reported that the number of men employed in the districts represented by the federation was 767,800, and the number of men in the union 592,444. There was an increase in the number of employed compared with last year of 156,800.

James Tasey, president of the Fall River, Mass., textile council, has notified the union representatives that under the wage agreement between the Manufacturers' Association and the council there will be a further reduction in wages in the cotton mills next month of about 8 per cent. The Fall River mills employ thirty thousand operatives.
