WISTER JOHNSON TELLS OF OXFORD UNIVERSITY

The Guard is indebted to Mrs. Drew Griffin for extracts from a couple of letters from her brother, Wister Johnson, who is one of the Rhodes students at Oxford, England. Among other things he says: "The last year's men tell us that we may be discouraged at first, but everything will be all right after a while. Some of the fellows who are already installed say that at dinner tonight they were ignored completely, even when they asked for things to be passed, and by freshmen, too, so it is evident that we Americans are in for some disagreeable experiences. . . . In London we visited Westminster Abbey, putting in the greater part of the afternoon there; also St. Paul's cathedral, and we also saw the houses of parliament and Buckingham palace and other places of interest. The two-wheeled busses and street cars were very strange to us. I think the English are very much behind in many ways. Their buildings, however, are much more beautiful than ours. We seemed to be objects of interest in both Liverpool and London and everybody turned to watch us pass and the newboys would yell, 'New York Herald' at us. The climate of Oxford is very similar to that of Oregon, though perhaps even more variable. Yesterday it was raining, but today it is clear and cold. The cold is penetrating on account of the moist air. Most of the Americans have colds on account of the damp weather, but it was just like old times to me, and so far I have enjoyed very good health. . . . I have bought a bicycle and am prepared to see the country now at close range. There are beautiful roads over here. After the mountain roads of Oregon, it seems no exertion at all to cover distances which would have been very tiring at home. . . . I am planning to see Oxford systematically from now on. Every Sunday afternoon I expect to see two or three of the colleges thoroughly and so on until the places of interest are well covered. The Rhodes men of last year are astonishingly well informed as to minute details concerning historic sites in Oxford, and I want to know the place thoroughly before I leave. Last Sunday I visited All Souls', Brasenose and Magdalen college (the last is pronounced Maud-lin). There was nothing of especial interest at All Souls'. Brasenose is the law school and has only men working for advanced degrees. Large shipment of 30-lb. OREGON TRACK SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED FOR COMING SEASON

Most of Dates Are Provisional
in Nature—First Con-
test Dec. 18th

The University provisional track
schedule has been posted by Manager
Dean and Trainer Hayward. The
schedule begins with the cross-
country run on December 15, the last
college day before Christmas vaca-
tion.

On January 16 will be run the in-
ter-class relay race of five miles.
Each class will be represented by
five men.

The next event comes on March 3,
when there will be an indoor meet,
probably in the Armory. At this
meet all athletics will be given a
place in the list, wrestling, running,
jumping and similar feats.

On February 2 may be held a
relay with O. A. C., either at Eu-
gene or Corvallis. No definite ar-
rangement has yet been made.

On April 17 the Columbia Indoor
Meet in Portland will open the regu-
lar season. The next proposed
meet may be with Whitman or Ida-
ho, or Washington State, or Wash-
ington University. Probably on May
22 the O. A. C.-Oregon meet will be
contested at Corvallis. On May 30
the triangular meet will draw the
team to Seattle. Sometime in June
in the Conference meet among the
eight Northwest colleges, Oregon
will finish the season.

The tryouts for the inter-clas-
s-cross-country will be held next Sat-
urday, December 12. There are
likely bunches of men out for all
the teams.
