DEPOT PARK WILL BE BUILT IN SHORT TIME

Meeting of Board of Governors of Commercial Club Held Last Night

At the regular weekly meeting of the board of governors of the Commercial club, the manager made his report in regard to the depot park. Early last week General Manager O'Brien, of the S. P. Company, returned the plans with a letter that the company could not accept them. At a conference held Friday in Portland, changes were made in the plans to suit Mr. O'Brien, some minor detail cut out and new plans ordered from the landscape architect. Other department heads of the company were seen in regard to the plan, as it was reported in Eugene that the company had contracted to bring the dirt from a distance by rail and Manager Hartog recommended having Eugene people haul it instead. About 1200 yards will be needed for a starter. General Superintendent Buckley and Superintendent Fields will take this matter up with the promotion department.

A request was also made by Mr. Hartog, while in Portland, of R. B. Miller to investigate the needs for a platform on the south side of the freight depot, to expedite the freight movement. This will be looked into.

Literature for Hotels.
A contract was authorized by the board with the Peck-Judah Information Bureau to place the club's literature throughout Southern California. In the San Francisco Information Bureau and in the hotels in Seattle, Tacoma and Portland. This will mean that nearly a hundred hotels will be constantly supplied with Eugene literature in the Peck-Judah hotel cabinets, and as the Peck-Judah company has the ticket-validation office at Seattle during the Yukon expedition, they reach more visitors than any other one concern.

The Kiser Photos.
The board inspected the first of Kiser's handpainted Eugene and Lane county views. Thus far Mr. Kiser has only taken views in and around Springfield, Eugene and Siuslaw. Twenty-two works of art are on hand. They are only samples to be returned to Mr. Kiser. After the holidays he will be able to finish such pictures as the club and Mr. Eaton will require.

The board authorized the manager to give the Ladies' Auxiliary the first view of these pictures at tomorrow evening's meeting and on Monday they will be on exhibit at the general December meeting.

The board authorized the issuing of 5000 "Who Said That" blotters and of 5000 souvenir albums as a Holiday number of "Nobody's"; these will contain some 46 views.

Hotel Proposition.
The hotel proposition was again discussed and plans drawn by Mr. Hartog, based on Mrs. W. F. Osburn's suggestions were submitted. It is proposed to issue bonds at 6 per cent for \$40,000, the Osburns to furnish the site and furnishings. The hotel to be four-story and basement, main entrance on E. 8th street, but large courtyard in center, facing the courthouse. Dr. Whitson appointed a committee consisting of D. A. Palmer, E. O. Potter and John H. Hartog to handle this matter. The proposed building is to be Mission style with red tiled roof, on the order of the artistic hotels in Southern California.

WORDING OF DEBATE QUESTIONS DETERMINED BY UNIVERSITIES

The question for the interstate debates among the state universities of Idaho, Washington and Oregon will be "Resolved, That, waiving constitutional objections, the federal government should impose a progressive income tax on all incomes above a certain amount." The wording is the one submitted by Oregon. Secretary Bond, of the league, announced that the votes of Washington and Idaho had been cast for this wording.

Washington submitted to her sister words. In Idaho's wording, "Waiving the constitutionality" was the main point.

Twenty men are expected to try-out for the debates on the Oregon team. Forty or fifty will attempt to make the teams at Washington. Among these are reported to be Kirsen girls.
