GILLETTE ABLE TO SIGN DEATH WARRANT

San Francisco, Dec. 9.—Though very weak, Governor Gillette was much better this morning. He passed a restless night in the hospital at Redding Cal., but his pulse and temperature are nearly normal. For the first time since Sunday he ate light food this morning and with relish. He is able today to attend to public business of pressing importance, and his physicians permitted him to sign the death warrants of the convicts condemned to die on Friday at San Quentin. Only very important business, however, was allowed to reach the Governor. The Governor was one of those poisoned at the luncheon given in honor of the launching of the collier Prometheus Saturday.

TREASURY DEFICIT UNUSUALLY LARGE

Washington, D. C., Dec. 9.—Secretary of the Treasury, George B. Cortelyou, submitted his annual report to congress today, showing the total receipts of the government for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1908, to be \$1,702,068,187.11, which sum added to the balance in the treasury at the beginning of the year total \$3,312,734,164.90. The aggregate of disbursements during the last fiscal year was \$1,589,786,889.59, leaving in the treasury a balance of \$1,722,947,275.21. The public debt at the end of the year was \$2,626,506,000, against which there was cash in the treasury amounting to \$1,314,626,000.

Upon the basis of existing laws, Secretary Cortelyou estimates the revenues for the ensuing fiscal year at \$788,796,000. The expenditures for the same period are placed at \$902,796,000, leaving a deficit of \$114,000,000.

"Bring \$100 under Creek bridge at 10 o'clock tonight, Saturday, or death. You will find a person there with a long red coat and give the shiners to him. Your blood will be on your own hands if you don't. X Y Z, A B C, the Black Hand."

The letter was immediately turned over to the Chief of Police.
