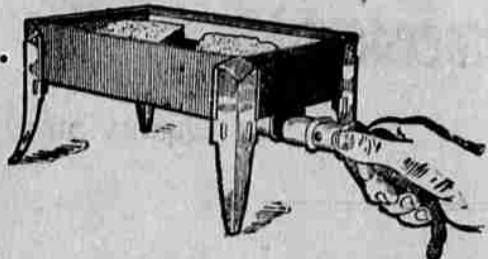

## PROGRESS OF SUIT AGAINST HON. H. R. KINCAID

The Salem Statesman gives the following regarding the status of the suit against ex-Secretary of State Kincaid to recover fees, alleged to be due the state:

The request of H. R. Kincaid, former secretary of state, that the case against him for the return of over \$60,000 in fees he is alleged to have collected and not turned over to the state while in office, be continued until after a similar suit against former Secretary of State Dunbar be decided by the supreme court, has developed what promises to be one of the prettiest legal battles seen in the local circuit court for years.

Kincaid, through his attorneys, made application for continuance of the case with County Clerk R. D. Allen yesterday morning. The attorneys for the state, who instituted the suit, declare that they will force the Kincaid trial to come to issue next Wednesday, December 16, despite remonstrance of Kincaid.

The attorneys have already secured judgment against Dunbar for practically \$100,000 for fees, alleged to have been collected and not turned over to the state. The matter is now before the supreme court and the suit has caused an immense amount of interest all over the state. The Kincaid case has never been tried before the circuit court, and because judgment has not been rendered, argue the attorneys for the state, the attorneys for Kincaid are desirous of taking a chance on the supreme court findings, delaying the trial and if the Dunbar judgment is thrown out by the higher court, request on technical grounds.

Every effort will be exerted by the state's attorneys to push the Kincaid matter to the same status as that now enjoyed by the Dunbar case so if the Dunbar case is found faulty from some technicality in legal procedure, but not on the strength of

## FOREIGNERS SEND MUCH MONEY HOME

New York, Dec. 14.—American dollars will furnish Christmas cheer in many humble homes in Europe this year. Since December 1 in fourteen days, several million dollars in foreign money orders have been issued by the New York postoffice.

The aggregate is considerably in excess of the figures of last year, although not up to the figures of some previous years. It is expected that the total, including large sums that will be carried away by steamships sailing this week, will amount to more than \$6,000,000.

There was a time when Ireland received by far the largest proportion of these Christmas gifts from her sons and daughters who had taken up new homes on this side of the Atlantic. In the last few years, however, she has been closely pressed for first place by Italy. A single ship sailing from New York last week carried nearly \$100,000 in money orders sent by Italians living here to relatives and friends in Italy. Large sums are sent to the United Kingdom, Germany, Hungary and Russia, with Denmark, Austria, Sweden, Belgium, Greece, The Netherlands and Switzerland following in the order named.

## CANNON WILL STILL BOSS THE HOUSE

Washington, Dec. 12.—It is understood that the Hepburn rules revision committee in the House will ask to be authorized to agree to compromise that the Speaker might suggest if desirable. This is considered a virtual back-down of the "reformers" who, a few days ago, attracted attention to themselves by their declaration of what they intended doing to the Speaker. It is also reported that members who talked with the Speaker today assured him that they were his friends and wished to avail themselves of his suggestion.

The work of revising the rules was started by conference between the members of the committee and Speaker Cannon and Representative Williams, former minority leader, as well as between the committee and other individuals among the element favoring revision of the rules.

## ALL ALLURING LINES DOOMED BY FASHION'S DECREE

Toledo, O., Dec. 13.—The official edict has been issued, and now the husband may picture how his wife will look in the coming new spring toggery. The ukase went forth yesterday from the semi-annual convention of the National Cloak, Suit and Skirt Manufacturers.

The main feature about the new styles for women appears to be the vertical effect given on the wearers. The suits will come in one, two and three pieces, all hipless, and one of the strongest features in the change will be the reduced size at the bottom of both separate and suit skirts.

Official Decree on Styles is as follows:

Two-piece tailored suits—Hipless and half-fitted jackets, cutaway and straight fronts, 34 to 42 inches long and 30 to 36 inches long for misses. Long, narrow coat sleeves.

Skirts—To be gored and of diminished fullness, with a tendency to high-waisted effects.

Three-piece suits—Without sleeves, with net or lace yokes, or made to be worn over waists with hipless jackets, cutaway fronts predominating. Long, smaller sleeves.

How to Build Tailored Dresses. Tailored dresses—One-piece complete dresses in both Princess and raised from the waists. Guimpé dresses more particularly for misses and juniors.

Separate Coats—Hipless and semi-fitted cloth jackets with some tendency toward cutaway effects, 32 to 42 inches long for ladies and 30 to 36 inches long for misses.

Coat-sleeved, tailoring or touring coats—Half-fitted Empire or hipless effects, 52 to 54 inches long.

Silk and satin coats—All lengths. Separate skirts, similar to suit skirts, but show more trimming, mainly in vertical effects.
