### EUGENE MEN WILL BE WITNESSES IN JAMES FINCH TRIAL

C. M. Kissinger and B. J. Walls Claim to Have Seen Struggle in Fisher's Office

That two witnesses from Eugene, B. J. Walls and C. M. Kissinger, will testify that they witnessed a struggle in Ralph B. Fisher's office the afternoon he was shot by James A. Finch is the sworn statement of C. H. Pigott, attorney for Finch, in an affidavit filed in the circuit court this morning, asking that subpoenas be issued for the appearance of the Eugene men to testify when the case of Finch is called for trial on Friday morning.

The affidavit of the attorney says he is informed that Walls and Kissinger will say that on the afternoon of November 28 they were standing on the sidewalk at a point opposite the windows of Fisher's office, and that on looking up they saw a struggle in progress.

Then, as the affidavit runs, they saw Finch standing with his back to the window and his hands extended in the air. A moment later they heard shots. They could recognize Finch because they had known him for many years, and they knew his features as he moved about quickly in the scuffle.

The call for these subpoenas shows that the attorneys for Finch are working on the self-defense theory despite the testimony of Miss Verma Burkhardt, Fisher's stenographer, who witnessed the shooting from the office door, and the physical surroundings, which show that Fisher was shot from the rear and while sitting in his chair.

In the original application for subpoenas the defense had asked that 12 persons from other parts of the state be directed to appear to testify for Finch, but lines had been drawn through ten of these names, and only Walls and Kissinger are to be called. The names of the other ten are still legible on the paper, and are as follows:

G. B. Malley, of Seaside; Dr. B. F. Martin and Annie Martin, of Gresham; Rev. L. H. Leach and M. E. Minster, of Corvallis; Percy R. Kelly, George Gilchrist and D. H. Clevenger, of Albany; Dr. J. L. Hill and Gale S. Hill, of Eugene.—Journal.

### ONE AND A THIRD RAILROAD FARE TO ALL OREGON POINTS

All passengers on the Southern Pacific will be entitled to a one and one-third fare, round trip, Friday and Saturday. The Harriman lines in Oregon have granted to the traffic originating in college towns the usual Christmas round trip rate, but as the interstate commerce law forbids any particular class being favored, the whole public has the same privilege as the collegiate students.

Most of the University of Oregon students, who live away from Eugene, will go to their homes over the state. Of the five hundred in Eugene now probably one hundred and fifty will still be here Monday. College officially closes for the holidays Friday night. The length of the vacation is two weeks and two days.
