## HIGH SCHOOL DEBATE, EUGENE VS. ALBANY, TOMORROW AFTERNOON

Tomorrow afternoon the first debate of the central division of the Oregon Interscholastic Debating League will be held in the Eugene high school assembly hall at 2:30 between the teams of the Eugene and Albany high schools.

In this league there are some thirty-five high school teams. These are divided into four districts, of which the central includes the towns of Eugene, Albany, Salem, Silverton and Cottage Grove. These meet each other in four debates and the remaining four debate for the championship of the district.

Little is known of the comparative strength of any of the different teams until after this first debate. The local school has a team composed of all new men—Calkins, Morris and Collier. They are all seniors. They have the advantage of having a man who is considered perhaps the most efficient in the state, Ben Huntington, to coach them. All three of the men received their training in the Amadison Literary Society. The Albany school is represented by Wilson Perry, Frank Bryant and Cleo Weaver. They have never debated in the league before.

The question up for tomorrow afternoon is, "Resolved, That all institutions of higher education be placed under control of a board." The question is especially one of local and general importance throughout the state, directly concerning the State University here. It will be well handled without any question by the young orators.

### PAPKE-KELLY GO DECLARED DRAW

Los Angeles, Dec. 16.—Jim Jeffries gave one of the best decisions rendered hereabouts in a long time when he called a draw between Billy Papke and Hugo Kelly at Vernon arena last night. Naturally there are those who claim a victory for both men, but Jeffries is generally supported in the justness of his verdict.

Billy Papke is resting in a Turkish bath house today with a terribly beaten face and a soreness of heart.

In a storm of disappointment he declared after the fight that he intended to quit the ring for good. This is not taken very seriously and after the bruises have worn away Billy will probably be himself again.

The fact that Papke shows marks of the battle does not mean that Kelly out-fought him. It was the fact that Papke showed himself the aggressor at all times in addition to having Kelly in bad trouble that earned him a draw.

Superb ring generalship or luck saved Kelly from a knockout in the fourth round. Papke caught him a clip with his left to the jaw. Kelly fell flat and Jeff counted nine over him before he found his feet.
