FIRST INTERSCHOLASTIC BASKETBALL GAME TO BE PLAYED TONIGHT

High Schools of Albany and Eugene will Battle for Supremacy at Armory

This evening opens the league basketball season. The game tonight, played between the Eugene and Albany high schools is considered as important as any game to be played this year. Albany, with a last year's team in perfect form, comes prepared to win. Outside critics say that Albany has the best chance to win. Judging, of course, from the fact that they have played together so long and have had the practice that the local boys have not.

Owing the past week Coach Stine has done little short of marvelous work in adjusting and fitting his machine into the most perfect balance. In the alumni game a week ago the boys showed wonderful team work at such an early point in the season. This week has been devoted to a great extent to accuracy in basket throwing in which the boys showed themselves the weaker.

Watson, the fast forward, who starred in the alumni game by his numerous baskets and speed, will doubtless be again an important factor in the rise of the score. Koch will play the other forward. Last week he showed himself to be invaluable by his heady plays. The Albany man who plays center will have to "go some" if he proves a match for Burton. Mummy plays probably as consistent a game as any member of the team. Not only can he make his baskets but he shows the greatest speed and quick thinking. He plays guard. Young at guard, is also showing up splendidly.

This game is of utmost importance because if Eugene can win from Albany, she can feel pretty certain that the pennant will come here at the end of the season.

In basket ball, as well as in any other sport, a team's playing varies directly with the amount of support it receives. This applies especially to the home team. In this game, therefore, it is highly essential that as many attend as possible can. This is desirable from a financial standpoint. It costs considerable to bring a team here and if the expenses are not all met by the gate receipts, they will have to come out of the students. The boys are paying out considerable and putting in hard practice in order to represent Eugene with a creditable basketball team. Their efforts should be appreciated by the public. The high school team will be the only one to represent Eugene this season and it should receive undivided support.
