To Debate Whitman.

The committee on Oratory and Debate will write to Whitman College, Walla Walla, Wash. for a debate this winter on the income tax question. The idea is that of Samuel Elliot, the debate coach, who believes that a second debate squad of sufficient quality is in college to insure a good contest with Whitman.

No men on the interstate teams will be allowed to enter the tryouts. The first eight of the number who did not make the squad will alone be permitted to tryout in the final choice of three men in January. In case Whitman cannot debate, Whitworth College will be tried for a date.

PHYSICIAN NOT LIKELY TO REVIVE EXECUTED MAN

Trenton, N. J., Dec. 19.—County Physician Frank G. Scammell is still of the opinion that he will be able to set at rest the dispute that a man who has died in the electric chair does not die there, but under the knife of the surgeon at the subsequent autopsy. But according to the authorities the physician is not likely to have a chance to test his theory next Monday, as he had planned to do, in the case of John Mantasanna, who is to be electrocuted in the state prison on that date.

The prison officials have decided to be guided by the opinion of the eminent legal authorities who have told them that if they lent themselves to the proposed experiment of Dr. Scammell they would be liable to indictment and impeachment for malfeasance in office. Head Keeper Osborne of the state prison, declares that he does not propose to get himself into any trouble with such experiments. He has therefore decided that Dr. Scammell will not be invited to the electrocution of Mantasanna. The electrocution will be deferred until evening and the keeper will not turn the body over to the physician until the next morning, when there will be no possibility of his resuscitating the victim of the death chair.

"U. OF O. MEDICAL DEPARTMENT FAKE" ALLEGES TELEGRAM

Institution is Run for Stock Company—Five Dollars for Five Lectures

While freely admitting that within the last few years several thousand dollars have been expended in improving the Medical Department of the University of Oregon, and that its standard of excellence has risen appreciably, leading members of the profession in Portland declare that for a lengthy period the institution has been a "fake" and a "joke," and that it has always been and is now being conducted almost entirely in the financial interest of Dr. Simeon E. Joseph, manager and dean of the faculty, and a few others.

Their contention is that without a state appropriation which will at least permit the institution to be brought up to the standard of second class Eastern medical colleges, it is useless, and that unless the legislature can be prevailed upon to grant an appropriation of sufficient size it should be abolished. To continue the college longer under present conditions, it is maintained, would be nothing more than an imposition on the public, which is represented as already suffering severely because of the "palpable fraud" which they allege is perpetrated by sending forth as practitioners a horde of persons without the rudiments of the medical and surgical knowledge necessary for life-saving and health-preserving work.

Institution Under Ban.

In this connection, it is pointed out that the Medical Department of the University of Oregon is now under the ban of the American Medical association, and that its name has been expunged from the lists of this institution. According to Secretary Colwell, whose letter is now in the possession of Dr. A. C. Pantou, who recently resigned his position as president of the Oregon State Board of Medical Examiners, this action was taken by the association because of the persistent refusal of Dr. Joseph to furnish it with data as to the entrance requirements which must be met by students.

That several medical men of high standing at present have attended the college is admitted, but it is denied that the knowledge and training acquired by them as an equipment for practice came in the main from that institution. Other sources or supplemental institutions are given that credit. It is a noteworthy fact that among its most drastic critics are a number of physicians who were at some period students in the Medical Department of the University of Oregon.—Telegram.
