**STEAMER LOST.
 FOUR DROWNED**

Irada Goes on Rocks and Is a
 Total Loss

Crookhaven, Ireland, Dec. 22.—The British steamer, Irada, from Galveston to Liverpool, is a total wreck at Misenhead. The captain, four of the crew and the stewardess are drowned. The remainder of the crew of 65 men saved themselves. The wreck was due to the fog which has been hanging over the coast for some time.

In nearing the coast the ship lost her bearings and landed on the rocks almost before the officers knew their danger.
