JAMES PARVIN'S ESTATE VALUED AT \$15,000

Will of Pioneer Filed for Probate Today—Leaves Property to Wife and Children

The will of James Parvin, the Lost Valley pioneer, who died on December 17, was filed for probate this morning. The property of the estate is valued at \$15,000 and is left to his widow and children. The provisions of the will, in brief, are as follows: To his daughter, Mrs. Ida Williams, is bequeathed \$500 in cash, also a debt of \$2000 which she owes him.

To his son, H. M. Parvin, is bequeathed 159.15 acres of land. To his wife is bequeathed the donation land claim of John B. Hanna and wife, except 7 acres sold to L. L. Addington and a small tract used by the school district; also a certain tract of 6.13 acres of land. After her death the whole shall go to his daughter, Mrs. Jennie Shafter.

To his granddaughters, Bertha Jacobs and Mabel V. Hills, is bequeathed \$100 each. All the rest of the property whatsoever is bequeathed to his wife. H. M. Parvin, his son, is named as sole executor without bonds. The will was made in Eugene on May 12, 1908.
