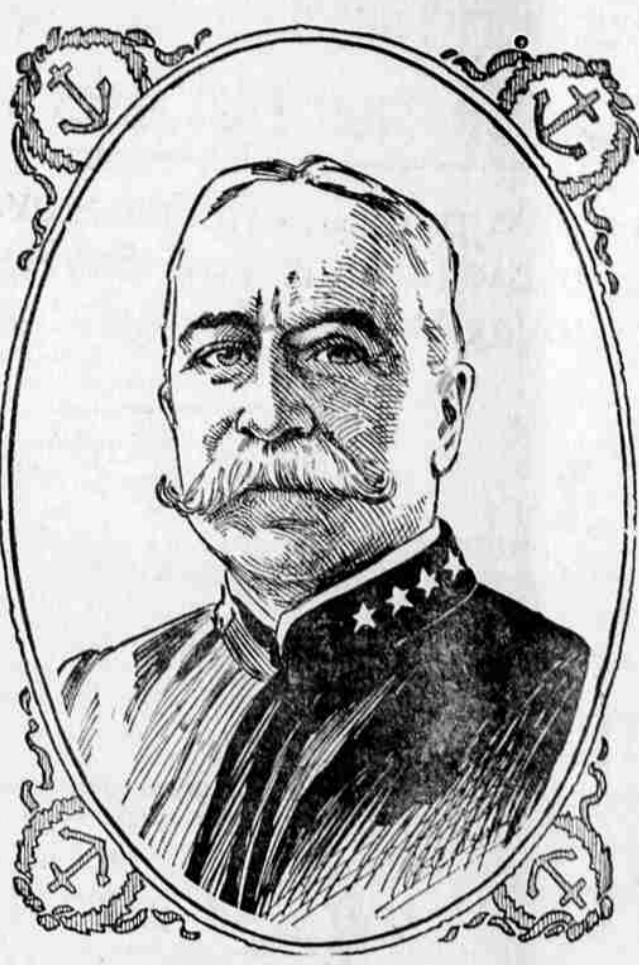

Stiles Judson and Lucien F. Durpee
appeared as counsel for Mr. Lilley.
The complainant was represented by
Walter C. Fleming, of New York, who
assisted Governor Hughes in the in-
surance and gas investigations.
