

## LINCOLN HOME AND HOSPITAL WILL BE BUILT

Half a Million Dollars Expected by 100th Anniversary of the Birth of Martyr President

New York, Dec. 28.—Half a million dollars will be offered in memory of Abraham Lincoln by the people of this country between Christmas and the 100th anniversary of his birth, according to the leaders of a national memorial movement which has been started in this city. To permanently endow the Lincoln Hospital & Home, where thousands of colored and white patients have been treated, educated and housed here for the last 69 years, is the object for which American citizens in every section of the land are to be invited to devote their individual tributes to the martyred president. Seventy-five thousand dollars has been promptly subscribed in this city to start this fund and its completion in time for the centenary celebration, is declared to be assured when the people of other cities and states learn of the project.

To Receive Funds. In crumpled dollar bills and stamp, as well as substantial checks, the working committee of this new Lincoln memorial movement is preparing to receive the response of the people from end to end of the country to their Christmas call for a living monument to Lincoln. Thousands of whites and colored persons,

who have alike received the free treatment, care and relief of the institution since long before the civil war, are today enlisting in the movement to perpetuate it in Lincoln's name. From the infirm old people who are wearying baskets for the fund in the home wards to the corps of a hundred graduate trained nurses who are spending its relief work in every part of the country, a volunteer army of beneficiaries will work to secure the future of this unique hospital in the name of the great emancipator.

Strong Indorsement. Medical and surgical leaders in this city are today offering to testify to the profession throughout the country that the educational influence of the institution, which is to be a perpetual memorial to Lincoln, is becoming a factor in the problem of health. A score of scientifically educated colored nurses are graduated from its training school each year and sent to every section of the land to cope intelligently with the spread of disease in the highest professional circles as well as among their own tenement of this work would prove a people. The continuation and considerable benefit to the hygienic welfare of the whole people, it is declared. The local good accomplished by this one of the largest private hospitals and clinics in this metropolis has for years especially recommended it to the profession as well as the charitable authorities here.

CAPTAIN JOHN BAKER DIES AT SALEM

Salem, Or., Dec. 28.—Captain John Baker, a well-known Oregon pioneer, died at his home near this city today, aged 92 years. Deceased came to Oregon from Missouri in 1847, stopping for a short time at Portland and then removing to Oregon City, where he conducted a hotel for two years. Late in 1849, he removed to Salem, where he operated a sawmill for several years. He started the first brickyard in this vicinity and made the brick for all the early buildings constructed of that material. Retiring from active business many years ago, he spent his declining years on his small farm east of this city. He leaves one daughter and three sons, Mrs. L. N. Roney of Eugene; O. C. Baker of Salem; J. O. Baker, of Boise; H. O. Baker of Portland. His wife died in 1881. The funeral will be conducted from the family home at 2 p. m. tomorrow. Rev. P. S. Knight officiating.

The Lincoln memorial on the old Lincoln homestead near Hodgenville, Ky., is almost completed and will be the scene of a great dedication ceremony on Feb. 12 next, the one hundredth anniversary of the birth of Abraham Lincoln. President Roosevelt will be the principal speaker of the occasion. The memorial building incloses the little log cabin where the great emancipator first saw the light of day. The new structure was built entirely through popular subscription by the Lincoln Farm association, of which Governor Joseph W. Folk of Missouri is president.
