AL KAUFMAN

BEAT JIM BARRY IN A SLOW FIGHT

Jeffries' Vernon Arena, Cal., Dec.
30.—A small crowd witnessed a slow
and uninteresting fight between Al
Kaufman and Jim Barry tonight in
which, contrary to expectations, Bar-
ry had the better of Kaufman, the
favorite in the betting. At the end
of the 25th round neither man was
greatly damaged, but Barry had the
better of it.

In the 39th round Barry's seconds
threw up the sponge when their man
was all but out. It was a slow, un-
interesting fight in which Barry had
the best of it up to the thirteenth
round, when his strength began to
fall him. Neither showed champion-
ship form and both took a lot of pun-
ishment.

Winner to Meet Roller
Tonight's fight was the first 45-
round contest ever scheduled in
Southern California, and the pros-
pect of a long mill meant much to
the devotees of the fight game. Kauf-
man was a heavy favorite in the bet-
ting, an abut few picked the Chic-
ago man as a likely winner. It was
stated that Barry had backed himself
to win at odds of 2 to 1. Some other
bets were placed at 10 to 6 and 10
to 7.

It is probable that the winner of
tonight's battle will first meet Dr.
B. F. Roller, of Seattle, who has al-
ready challenged, before a fight with
Johnson will take place.
Kaufman had the advantage over
Barry in weight of at least 16 pounds.
The fight was for 50 per cent of the
gate receipts, and each fighter was
guaranteed \$2500.

The fact that the winner of the
fight would likely prove to be the
next challenger for the heavyweight
championship of the world lent more
widspread interest to the contest
than any other that has been held
here for a long time.

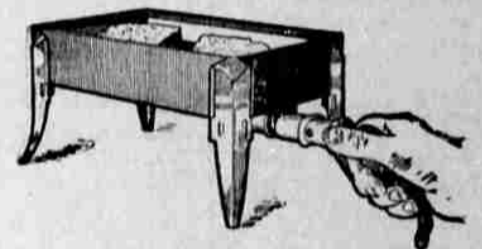
