EUGENE-GROWN BEETS CONTAIN MUCH SUGAR

Analysis Made by Sacramento
Sugar Co. Shows a Large
Percentage of Sugar

Manager Hartog of the Commer-
cial Club, has received the report of
an analysis made by the Sacramento
Valley Sugar Co. of several sugar
beets raised in Lane county and sent
the company by Mr. Hartog early this
winter. The analysis shows that
there is a large amount of sugar in
the beets—enough to justify growing
them here if a sugar factory could
be secured for this vicinity. The
beets sent from here contained, ac-
cording to the sugar company's anal-
ysis, from 14.6 to 18.1 per cent sug-
ar. The price the company pays for
the beets containing 13 per cent sug-
ar is \$5 per ton and an additional
25 cents per ton for every one per
cent above that. The best beet sent
by Mr. Hartog for analysis was that
grown by L. B. Rossman. A ton of
this quality would bring \$5.27. The
others were sent by O. Casperson and
W. P. Bradley.

NEW CHARTER ATTENDS ITS FIRST MEETING

third, in the alley between Second
and Third streets, beginning at High
street and extending to the Willam-
ette river, will cost \$2,353.00. A
fourth, between Tenth and Eleventh,
from Jefferson street west two
blocks, will be assessed at \$580.04.
The fifth, beginning at the manhole
of an 8-inch sewer at the intersec-
tion of Thirteenth and Alder streets,
extending 421 feet, will reach the
sum of \$392.00. The sixth sewer
will be on Twelfth street, from Alder
to Hilyard.

Smaller Matters.
The Warren Construction Co. was
ordered paid money held back,
amounting to more than \$4,000, for
work which was not altogether sat-
isfactory, with the provision that
the paving company give an indemn-
ity bond.

The city recorder was ordered to
notify that interest would be charged
those who have to pay assessments for
street work or sewers, only after
their money is due the city.

The ordinance for the extension
of the Hotel Griggs, belonging to M.
F. Griggs, was passed, provided that
the specifications were satisfactory
to the fire and water committee.

The finance committee and city at-
torney were ordered to find out who
should pay for a cesspool near the
Paterson school.

The situation of a signal light for
the police was referred to police
committee to take up with the man-
ager of the telephone company.

The city surveyor was ordered to
survey under the supervision of the
street committee a roadway on the
north side of Skinner's Butte. A
road already exists there, and the
council made the order with the pur-
pose to improve the street eventually.
The Willamette Valley company
holds a forty-year lien on the land,
and a street can not easily be dedi-
cated without permission, a thing
which the council thought would not
be difficult.

The Water Board.
After the council adjourned, the
councilmen were called to a meet-
ing of the water board. The finance
committee of the council was
appointed the finance committee of
the water board to act with the sur-
intendent of the plant.

An order was also made which
segregated the water funds into two
portions, one from the sale of bonds,
and the other from rentals.

Bills for work in laying the pipe
on Hill Crest addition were paid.
Engineer Kelsey's bill for surveying
was also ordered paid.

Councilman Berger said that the
pipe laid in Hill Crest was new to
the best of his knowledge, when
some of the members reported that
people on the street had claimed the
pipe was second hand. In case the
pipe is shown to be second hand
Berger said that Crane & Co. will
gladly make it good.
