**OAKLAND SCHOOL TEACHER SKIPS**

Principal of Public Schools Seems to Have Gone to Foreign Lands

Roseburg, Or., Jan. 7.—Professor Sawyer is gone for good. He drew all of his money, \$2,000, from the Oakland bank, took most of his clothing, paid all of his debts and gave his wife \$125 for a Christmas present. The theory advanced by Oakland people is that he had a wife in the East who he was not divorced from. He came to Oregon five years ago from Pennsylvania and transferred from the Odd Fellows in the East to Oakland; he also joined the Oakland Masonic lodge, and was elected worshipful master. He married Miss Emily Devore, of Yoncalla, two years ago. He was an honest citizen and a good educator and a Sunday school and church worker. Oaklanders think he took the steamer for foreign lands.

Roseburg, Or., Jan. 6.—Professor George Sawyer, principal of the Oakland public schools of this county, has disappeared and his friends and relatives are seeking his whereabouts. Shortly after Christmas Professor Sawyer left Oakland for Red Bluff, Cal., to spend a few days duck hunting in that vicinity. He was expected home last Sunday night so as to be ready for the re-opening of the school Monday morning.

His failure to appear aroused alarm and telegraphic inquiries were made. It was found that he had registered at a hotel at Red Bluff December 29, but no further trace of him has been learned. It is not known how long he was at the hotel at Red Bluff. That he has been the victim of foul play or has met with some serious accident while hunting are the theories advanced here. The Oakland lodge of Odd Fellows, of which Professor Sawyer was a member, has joined in the quest, and unless the missing man is heard from by Wednesday morning the lodge will send two men to Red Bluff to investigate, one being commissioned as a deputy sheriff. Mrs. Sawyer is at the family home in Oakland and is on the verge of a nervous collapse.
