GREATEST
SNOW STORM
IN YEARSHeaviest Fall in Eugene Since
Early Eighties—Eight
Inches Deep

The snow storm that has been raging in Portland and other points north of here, even as close as Albany, for the past several days, finally struck Eugene last night, and up to this afternoon about eight inches of the "beautiful" had fallen.

There was a sudden change in the atmosphere yesterday afternoon, the warm rain turning to a cold down-pour, and about 7 o'clock in the evening snow began to fall. It fell fast and heavy and within two hours it was three or four inches deep. When the people awoke this morning they were surprised to find about seven inches on the ground. During the entire day the snow has fallen intermittently and the temperature has remained low, causing all that fell to remain on the ground.

Sleighting General

For the first time in many years sleighting was general in Eugene today. Everybody who had any old kind of a sleigh or bob sled rigged it up and enjoyed the exhilarating sport so common in the East. Recent arrivals from the Eastern states are in their glory, while the Oregonians are not so well pleased with conditions, although most of them enjoy the snow on account of its novelty.

Affects Street Car Service

Street car service has been had during the day on account of the snow becoming packed between the rails and the pavement. The cars have run all day, but not on regular schedule time, as it is impossible to make the schedule. On Willamette street, where the team traffic is heavy, the cars had the most trouble. The drays and wagons passing over the tracks of the car line sweep the snow into the grooves and make it very troublesome. Often the cars have to back up and make a "running shoot" over especially bad places on the tracks.

Reports from all parts of the county indicate that the snow is uniform in depth, except in the foothills and mountains, where it is much deeper. Stockmen are busy taking care of their cattle and sheep, and if the snow remains on long it is expected that a good many lambs and calves will die.

River High

The river was twelve feet above low water mark this morning, the highest point it has reached this winter. Owing to the cold weather, however, it is receding and there is no danger of a freshet unless the snow should be melted suddenly by a Chinook wind.

Old timers say this is the heaviest snow since 1884, when it fell to a depth of a foot or so and remained on the ground for a couple of weeks or more. During that time the snow crusted over and froze hard enough to hold up a man. There was much loss of stock at that time.

LADD WILL PAY
SMALL DEPOSITORS
OF DEFUNCT BANK

Portland, Ore., Jan. 7.—Although not in any way obligated by the agreement entered into to pay the liabilities of the defunct Title Guarantee & Trust company, William M. Ladd will tomorrow distribute to 1900 depositors who had \$250 or less in the wrecked bank, approximately \$170,000.

When taken into consideration that Mr. Ladd, under the terms of his agreement, will also pay the annual interest on all claims filed and approved by the United States circuit court, amounting to \$60,000, the financier's voluntary offer to settle with the small depositors before the required time will cause great rejoicing in the ranks of those who had their meager savings in the counting-house.

Mr. Ladd's offer to take up the small accounts comes as a distinct surprise to even those familiar with the liquidation movement, and will result in the placing of \$170,000 in immediate circulation.
