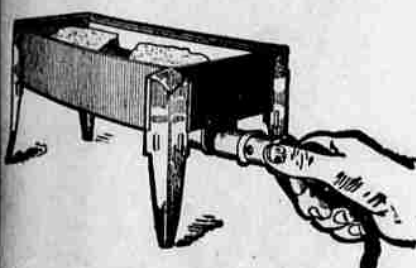

"BEN HUR" NEXT WEEK

To Fill Week of Jan. 18 at the Hellig Theatre, Portland

Towering triumphantly as the most massive and picturesque as well as the most impressive dramatic spectacle in the history of the world, "Ben Hur" will seek new honors at the Hellig theatre, Portland, on Monday evening, January 18, where it will remain for an engagement of one week. In addition to the regular evening performances, special matinees will be given on Wednesday and Saturday.

Of all the spectacular productions of modern times, none has been credited with so long a run of prosperity as this great and popular dramatic spectacle, "Ben Hur" is today crowned with a record of more than 2500 performances in America and 200 in London in a little over nine years, and has been seen by more than seven million people. The success of the play is credited to the religious sentiment that prevails in the theme, making it particularly attractive to non-theatregoers, who as a rule avoid the playhouse, owing to religious scruples. "Ben Hur" has the endorsement of the leading lights of the church world, and has appealed to all theatregoers as the most powerful drama that has ever been created for the stage.

Wallace had few peers and no superiors in the art of presenting to the eye the imagery of scriptural scenes. In "Ben Hur," his masterpiece, he gives the life, the color, the feeling of the time of Christ. With these he presents an intense heart story, a heroic drama, filled with the tenderest emotions, tinged with the romance of love and war, exalted by the evidence of divine miracles performed by the Nazarene. The symbolism of Rome and Jerusalem, of Jew and Gentile, of peace and war, are shown, surrounding the great mystery of the presence of Christ. In order to take care of out-of-town patrons for "Ben Hur" Manager Calvin Hellig, of the Hellig theatre, will fill mail orders in accordance with date of their receipt, when accompanied by remittance. The scale of prices will range from 50 cents to \$2.00. Seats will go on sale on Thursday, January 14.

ALL BODIES OF MINE EXPLOSION VICTIMS RECOVERED

Duquoin, Ill., Jan. 11.—With the recovery of additional bodies last night it is thought all the victims of yesterday's explosion in the Letter coal mine at Zeigler have been recovered. Four victims are negroes, four Americans and thirteen foreigners. Only three escaped.

Zeigler, Ill., Jan. 10.—The series of mishaps in Joe Letter's famous \$1,000,000 colliery here during the last few years reached a climax shortly after 1 o'clock this morning, when a mysterious explosion killed 24 men.

Nineteen of the dead have been recovered, five are missing and undoubtedly dead, and two more are injured critically.

This is the second serious disaster to the Zeigler Coal Company's property, which has been the scene of several minor fatalities and where for more than two years a desperate labor war was waged as the result of a strike. An explosion in 1935 killed 35 men at work in the mine.

The explosion was remarkable in that except for the many dead it left scarcely a trace and the interior of the mine today shows no sign of the damage.

A spark from a trolley pole of an electric motor coming in contact with a pocket of gas is assigned as the cause of the explosion.
