The great exposition contest has now reached the interesting stage, where nearly every candidate has aroused her friends to the most strenuous efforts to land the prize. All will try not only for the trip, but for one of the grand capital prizes as well--the \$200 residence lot in Eugene or the naming of the chaperone for the exposition party.

The special offer of additional votes which closes at 6 p. m. today, has been productive of a large amount of business, and the issue of coupons during the past week has, as was expected, broken all previous records. Not all of these coupons have been voted as many of the candidates are building up a reserve for future use, and are thus keeping their real strength from their opponents. As in a regular election, this is a case of "playing politics," and some of the candidates are developing into real shrewd campaign managers. It is a fascinating game to play and the young ladies are showing remarkable ability in this respect. This condition is an excellent indication that the result will not be known on the last day of the contest. EXPOSITION NOTES.

A typical Chinese street scene will Pacific

be reproduced at the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition in Seattle next year. In the streets of China the natives will live the same as they do in their Far Eastern homes.

The annual senior and junior championships of the National Amateur Union of America will be held in Seattle next year. The exposition is building a big athletic stadium from where all sporting events will take place. Returned Olympic contestants will also be present.

North Carolina plans a state building at the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition this year in which the South will be well represented by an exhibit of tobacco, cotton, fine woods, minerals and agricultural products.

The Spokane County building at the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition in 1909 will represent an expenditure of \$10,000 and will be of Spanish mission architecture.

The latest style of the automobile fire engine will be demonstrated on the grounds of the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition at Seattle this year.

In the Canadian building at the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition will be more than 18,000 square feet of exhibit space.

The Methodist church, through its laymen and pupils all over the United States, will advertise the religious features of the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition to be held in Se-

attle in 1909.

Since many of the big universities of the United States will be represented at Seattle next year in the athletic games it is planned to have tents on the grounds to represent each university and students will locate one another through registers in the big tent city.

A fine stock exhibit is assured for Seattle next year during the progress of the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition. Every fair association in British Columbia and the Northwest will be represented. The stock show will be held two weeks commencing September 27.

Recently the public parks of Portland and Tacoma, and the residents of Seattle donated 25,000 geranium plants to be used in beautifying the grounds of the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition in 1909.

FRAZIER SPEAKS ON
BROWNSVILLE AFFAIR

Continued From Page One.)

various investigations Senator Frazier said there was no question as to the guilt of the soldiers of the Twenty-Fifth Regiment. He justified the President in his discharging of the entire body of troops. Speaking of the incentive of the soldiers for the commitment of the crime, he said:

"No one not familiar with the real character of the negro race knows or can fully appreciate the intensity of feeling with which he resents any apparent discrimination against him on account of his race and color. This is strikingly illustrated in the intense opposition of the negro to those laws in effect in some states providing for the separation of the races in railway coaches even where the accommodations are equal and exactly alike. It was admitted by many of the soldiers in their testimony that this subject together with the subject of indignations which they claimed had been influenced upon some of them were frequent matters of discussion in the barracks of the soldiers."

Their restriction in the saloons of Brownsville, Mr. Frazier said, gave ample incentive for the resentment that was shown among them against the people of the town.
