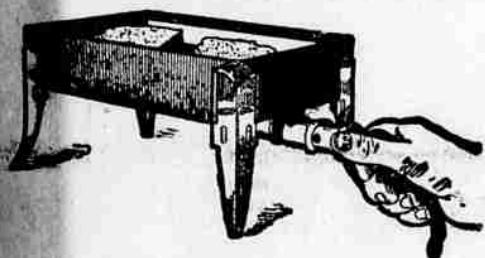

EVERYBODY TALKS OF EUGENE AND HER PROGRESSIVENESS

Commercial Traveler Tells How City Is Given Great Deal of Free Advertising

"Wherever you go," said J. J. Murray, a well-known commercial traveler, at the Hoffman House this morning, "you hear of Eugene and her progressiveness. As far east as Baker City and as far south as Dunsmuir, Cal., you hear as much about this city as you do in Portland. Eugene's growth is very noticeable to one who comes here only once in every few months. This is my first trip to this city in six months, and I notice great progress in that short time. Two handsome brick blocks that were not even started when I was here last are now nearing completion and I notice other improvements about the city that are surprising. Eugene is getting more free advertising in account of her progressiveness than any other city in the Northwest, and I think the extensive street paving that the city has done during the past year and a half is largely responsible for it. I was in LaGrande the other day and two merchants there asked me if it would be advisable to sell out there and come to Eugene to engage in business. I could not advise them as to the wisdom of such a move, but I told them that there was as much difference in a business way and in nearly every other way between Eugene and LaGrande as there is between day and night."

Pursuant to an order of the common council January 11th, 1909, bids will be received at the office of the city recorder until 7:30 p. m. January 25, 1909, for the improvement of the following streets in the city of Eugene:

Olive street, from Tenth to Eleventh.

West Eleventh street, from Olive street to Lincoln street, and

Pearl street, from Sixth street to Eleventh street.

By the construction of cement curbing along both sides of said streets and by paving said streets with bituminous asphalt or other hard surface pavement in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor prepared by the city engineer, and the provisions of ordinances Nos. 814, 815 and 816, all of said ordinances having been passed by the common council on the 2d day of December, 1908, and approved by the mayor on the 5th day of December, 1908.

All work to be done under the supervision of the street committee, and to be approved by them. And all bidders shall include with each bid a certified check in a sum equal to 5 per cent of the amount bid, payable to J. D. Matlock, mayor.

PARLIAMENT OF DOMINION IS IN SESSION

Ottawa, Ont., Jan. 20.—The first session of the Eleventh Parliament of Canada was opened today with the usual ceremonial. A brilliant military escort accompanied Lord Grey from Rideau Hall to the parliament buildings, and the grand of Nepean Point received a salute as the governor general entered the senate chamber. In the red chamber the attendance was unusually large when Lord Grey delivered the speech from the throne.

The election of a speaker and all other formalities attending the organization for the session will take place tomorrow. Charles Marcell, who for four years has been speaker, seems assured of re-election.

Present indications point to a comparatively short session of parliament. The principal measures to come up include the new insurance act, Hon. Mr. Aylesworth's bill to prevent the corrupt payment of secret commissions either in government or private business, a bill to establish a separate portfolio of labor, a bill to extend the boundaries of Manitoba, Ontario and Quebec, measures for the relief of the Grand Trunk Railway, and a bill to amend the present rules of parliamentary procedure with a view to expediting the transaction of public business and preventing wasting of time in useless debate.

The estimates for the year will be cut down as much as possible, commensurate with the actual needs of the public service, and every effort will be made to meet the temporary falling off in public revenues by a corresponding reduction in expenditures.
