PORTLAND MARKET REPORT.

Portland, Or., Jan. 21.—Eastern advices indicate a better feeling in the cascara bark market, probably because of the position taken by the Pacific Cascara company, but the improvement has not reached this end, so far as orders are concerned. The latest issue of the New York Journal of Commerce says of the bark market in that city: "Cascara sagrada was in rather more inquiry and the quotations of 3 1/2@3 cents were nominally steady. The combination on the Coast is holding well and the one large holder not in the agreement is exerting no pressure to sell." There is much interest here in knowing who the large independent holder is, as it was thought that everyone who had any considerable quantity of bark was in the Cascara company. Egg Buyers Scarce. The egg market continues to soften, not because of the receipts which are only moderate, but owing to the lack of interest on the part of buyers. Supplies on the street, therefore, are accumulating. The general quotation on Oregon ranch yesterday was 40 cents, with some holders offering to sell at 37 1/2 cents. Poultry also dragged, but there was no material reduction in prices, which are now comparatively low. A good many chickens were carried over last night. There were no further developments in the butter trade. Most of the creameries are quoting 37 cents, but a few adhere to the cold weather price. Hop Buyers Pientiful. There are more buyers than sellers in the hop market. Most of the dealers have orders in their possession, but find it difficult to do business on account of the firm views of growers. California advices received yesterday note a strengthening in values in that market similar to that which has taken place here. The J. W. Seavey Hop company in the last few days has bought 190

A firm undertone prevails in the potato market, but there is not much doing yet on shipping account. Buy yesterday quoted \$1.60@1.75 at country points for fancy stock. Onion prices are wholly nominal and it is not likely there will be any buying before next week until the frozen stock is in good condition. The jobbing market for vegetables and fruit was fairly active. A shipment of Japanese oranges is expected today.
