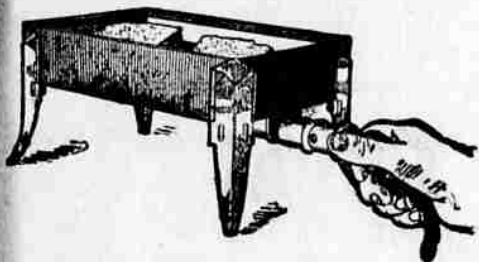

DRS. ATWOOD SENT TO JAIL AT PORTLAND

Judge Cleland Sentences Them
to Five Months' Im-
prisonment Each

Drs. C. H. and C. H. T. Atwood, father and son, were sentenced in the circuit court by Judge Cleland yesterday afternoon to serve five months in the county jail. They were recently convicted of having maintained a nuisance in conducting the Atwood Maternity Hospital at Tremont station on the Mount Scott car line.

Neither of the defendants were in the court room when sentence was pronounced, being represented by their attorney, M. B. Meacham. Neither were they present when the jury returned its verdict recently, though the elder Atwood appeared at the courthouse less than an hour later to inquire if the verdict had been returned. They are both out on bail.

Their attorney asked for an arrest of judgment, which was promptly denied. The convicted men have ten days in which to file a motion for a new trial. —Oregonian.

BANDIT RAISULI KEEPS VOW AND SHEARS HIS LOCKS

Paris, Jan. 22.—Raisuli, the former brigand, now a person of considerable consequence as the governor of Tangier, was the chief actor at Fez recently in a quaint ceremony.

Many years ago, when for his misdeeds the robber was imprisoned by his enemy, Abdes Sadek, he swore by the holy patron of Fez that he would never cut his hair until he had revenge. For seven years, loaded with fetters, he languished in the dark prison of Mogador.

Then not only came his liberation, but he obtained the post of governor of Kabyles, outside Tangier. He at once thought he would be able to rid himself of his flowing locks, but he still had powerful enemies at the court of Fez, and he had to postpone the ceremony.

Now, however, events have permitted him to redeem his oath, as he has acquired influence with Muley Hafid, and has been appointed to succeed Abdes Sadek, paying the respectable bribe of 2,000,000 francs for the privilege.

He, therefore, repaired to the great mosque of Muley Dris, and the imposing ceremony was witnessed by his numerous admirers. His hair, which in the course of twelve years has attained a length of about half a yard, was duly shorn, but Raisuli preserved a small portion of his beard. It is now reported that Raisuli intends to renounce the British protection, which was formerly of much value to him.
