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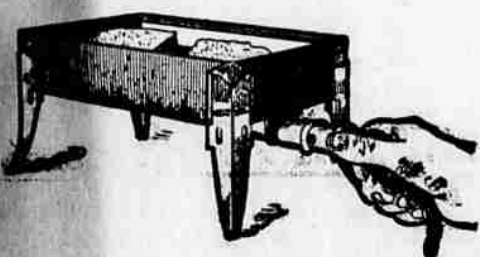

### FINED FOR DUMPING SAWDUST IN RIVER

Mosby Creek Sawmill Man Has  
To Dig Up Fifty  
Dollars

Frank Chapman, the Mosby Creek mill man, was arrested by Deputy Game Warden Krank Slavin, of this city, this week and arraigned before Judge Vaughn, of this city, on charge of dumping saw dust into the creek. He was fined \$50 and costs, which were to have been paid by eleven o'clock Wednesday, but had not been paid yesterday. Attorney Medley, his attorney, had him acquitted on account of technicalities, on a former similar charge and Mr. Chapman is communicating with him for this case. We are told the arrangements of the mill waste could be easily made so as not to interfere with the Oregon game laws. Mr. Slavin tells this office that in the future he will lay his complaints before the district attorney at Eugene. Since, Mr. Chapman has placed a bond for his appearance within 15 days, allowing him time for Mr. Medley to return from Salem.—Western Oregon.

### GREAT COLLEGE SPEAKER WILL SPEAK WEDNESDAY

E. C. Mercer, a graduate of the University of Virginia, '23, a noted temperance speaker, will speak again Wednesday evening in Villard hall. He will be the guest of the different fraternity houses and college organizations during his stay.

Saturday night he addressed the University men between 7 and 8 o'clock in Villard hall. He told of the college men who had failed, become associates of the lowest order of creatures and had committed suicide.

As a young man Mr. Mercer went to the University of Virginia, and became prominent in its athletic and social life. He was a member of the Beta Theta Pi fraternity, the Senior society, member of the glee club, and captain of the Varsity baseball team. Mr. Mercer comes from an old Virginia family, and is a nephew of former President Arthur. With the fierce advantages of training and environment, he "found himself" the boxer of New York four years ago, a common "tramp," as he himself says.

### COTTAGE GROVE VOTES FOR CITY PARK

Special Election Carries by  
Sixty-one Majority—  
Other Notes

In the special municipal election held Wednesday for the purpose of accepting or rejecting the proposition to levy a special 4-mills city tax for two years from which to realize a fund of \$3,000 with which to purchase a beautiful, natural park site containing five acres, located conveniently across from all parts of the city on East Main street, to be dedicated to the city of Cottage Grove, carried by the surprising majority of 61 votes, it having been anticipated that the result would be much closer, for the proposition of voting a tax even for the most economical public purposes is anything but popular. However, public spirited citizens realize that a crisis was at hand so far as securing a convenient and stately public park, was concerned.

The news that Harry Brown, living south of this city, died Wednesday, was brought to town yesterday. The funeral is being held this afternoon.
