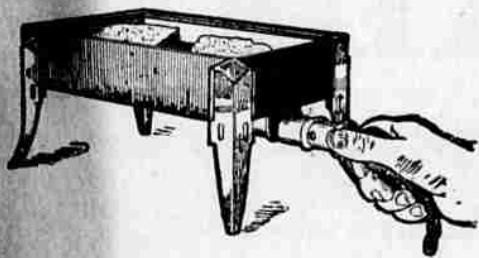

SITE CHOSEN FOR NEW UNIVERSITY GYMNASIUM

Six Hundred Students Expected
to Register for the
Second Semester

The new \$25,000 gymnasium, which will be built by next autumn, will probably be situated on the lots across from the dormitory at the corner of East Thirteenth and University avenue. The \$15,000 dormitory for girls, will probably be placed south of the present girls' dormitory, known as the Mary Spiller hall.

Two other sites have also been mentioned for the gymnasium. One is at the east end of the present athletic field, and the other on the forty-acre tract in the Gross addition. Eventually the athletic fields, tennis courts, and baseball diamonds may be moved to the forty-acre tract.

The committee on construction of the gymnasium is composed of Regents Ainsworth, Friendly and Holman. Trainer Hayward has plans for the building, for which he arranged when he went East last summer.

Second Semester Registration.
The registration the second semester is expected to approach 600 students in the regular undergraduate departments. Registrar Tiffany states that the new students will be expected to register on the Saturday before the opening week, as the students tax the capacity of the office forces on the following Monday.

PAT FARRELL DIES IN PORTLAND

Former Eugene Band Leader
and Indian War Veteran
Passes Beyond

The body of Captain Patrick H. Farrell, who died at his home, 713 First street, on Sunday last, will be removed today to Albany, Ore., for interment. Captain Farrell was born in Australia, and came to this state from California when just emerging into manhood. He enlisted for service in the Indian wars in Oregon and won distinction for his bravery. Married to Miss Julia Elkins, the Captain was a widower at the time of his death, and is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Lillian Farrell Powers and Miss Elizabeth Farrell, both of whom are residents of this city.—Oregonian.

"Pat" Farrell, as he was familiarly known, was a former resident of Eugene, leaving here 15 or 20 years ago. He was a band leader and was considered one of the best cornet players in the state when here. He conducted a marble shop in this city.
