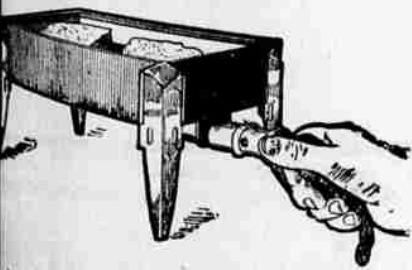

JUDGE WALTON FAVORS SIUSLAW RAILROAD

Editor Guard:—The proposed electric railroad from Eugene to Florence is the most important proposition to build up Eugene, and the entire county suggested for years. This road would open up a very rich part of Lane county in natural resources. There is timber enough along the line of this proposed road to build four or five roads like it. There is land enough in the vicinity of the road to support several thousand families. It would open up some of the finest fruit land in the state of Oregon. No place in Oregon, or any other state, raises finer apples than in the Siuslaw valley. Train loads of apples can be shipped from there every year. Very fine dairy farms can be established and built up there. Green grass and stock feed grows the year round in that part of the county. Even now thousands of pounds of cream is hauled from there in wagons, and shipped to Portland. It is well adapted to raising vegetables, berries and small fruit, when cleared up. The Siuslaw river and harbor can be improved in a few years so that good-sized steamers and ships can enter. Then Eugene can have an outlet for competition in freight, and hundreds of thousands of dollars will be saved to the people of Lane county each year for freight. It is for the best interest of each citizen of this town and county to do all they can to favor this proposed electric road—take stock in it and work for it. The whole county and upper part of the Willamette valley will be greatly benefited if this road is completed. It would mean 25,000 people for Eugene's population. Let us be a unit for its success.

OREGON'S MESSENGER SUBJECT TO \$1000 FINE

Washington, Jan. 27.—R. R. Butler, Oregon's electoral messenger, failed to arrive here yesterday with the electoral vote of Oregon. Montana's messenger also failed to arrive. The votes should have been delivered by the delegated electors by Monday last. Failure to deliver will not prevent the Oregon and Montana votes from being counted, as a copy was forwarded by mail and has been in the hands of the vice president for more than a week. Failure to arrive in the specified time, however, does subject the messengers to a fine of \$1000 each, which penalty is imposed by law for the non-delivery of the vote before the third Monday in January. Should this be imposed on the Oregon man his entire mileage will be consumed, as well as \$250 more, which he must pay from his own pocket. The vice president yesterday called the attention of Senators Fulton, of Oregon, and Dixon, of Montana, to the fact that the vote had not arrived.
