DANISH KING BELOVED BY ALL HIS SUBJECTS

Copenhagen, Jan. 29.—The third anniversary of the accession of King Frederick VIII was celebrated as a public holiday throughout Denmark today. Flags fluttered from public and private buildings and many pictures of the king and queen were displayed. During the day deputations from societies throughout the kingdom called upon his majesty and presented addresses of congratulation.

King Frederick has enjoyed a successful rule during the three years that have elapsed since he came to the throne. The love and respect that he has ever enjoyed among his subjects has increased, and today he stands in the foremost rank among European rulers in point of popularity.

The splendid mental and moral qualities of the king were well known and universally admired before he came to the throne. Since he was called upon to succeed his lamented father, the beloved King Christian, Frederick has displayed a remarkable versatility and a knack of interesting himself in all that concerns his kingdom and his people that has surprised even those who knew him best.

No one in all Denmark puts in busier days than does his majesty. While he wisely refrains from taking an active part in politics he follows closely all public movements. He makes it an unvarying rule to follow all important debates in both houses of the Riksdag. He is deeply interested in educational matters, and since he ascended the throne he has continued to act as chancellor of the university which he attended as a student. His interest in the army is keen, and he has introduced several reforms which have improved the lot of private soldiers, as the result of which he is extremely popular with the troops. He is also head of the Free Masons in Denmark, and takes an active part in a great variety of philanthropic organizations and movements.

ANOTHER PIONEER PASSES TO THE BEYOND

Died.—At his home in Portland on Friday, January 8, 1909 at 2 o'clock p. m., of dropsy of the heart, E. L. Smith, aged 68 years, 1 month and 14 days.

Deceased was born in Polk county, Missouri, November 24, 1840, and when but a boy he crossed the plains with his father and brothers, arriving in the Willamette valley the fall of 1849. He spent the most of his life on the old donation land claim taken by his father until 1901, when he purchased property in Springfield and moved his family there, and in December, 1907, he sold his property at that place and moved back to the old home at Natron. In June, 1908, he sold his farm at Natron and moved with his family to Portland, where he spent the rest of his life.

Besides the host of friends who mourn his death he leaves a wife and seven children, and three brothers, who are as follows: Mrs. Sarah E. Smith, his wife; daughters—Mrs. A. H. Sunderman, of Pendleton; Mrs. A. C. Powers, of Silver Lake; Mrs. John O'Connor, Mrs. Dollie Strayer, Mrs. Etta Anders and Miss Fae Smith, all of Portland; Bert F. Smith, of Echo, Or. The brothers are William F. and Jesse H. Smith, of Natron, and Alfred R., of Coburg.

The remains were laid to rest in the Rose City cemetery near Portland on Thursday, January 21, 1909, at 2:30 p. m.

GROSSCUP MAY RESIGN FROM FEDERAL BENCH

Standard Oil's Friend Is About
Ready to Give Up
His Place

Chicago, Jan. 29.—The old story that Judge Peter S. Grosscup intends resigning from the Federal bench was revived today and given a new twist, so as to bear on the United States senatorial fight at Springfield, by inserting in it a report that W. J. Calhoun, who is in the senatorial race, was to get Judge Grosscup's place. As before, Judge Grosscup denied he was about to resign.

H. H. Kohlman, who recently resigned from Washington, D. C., and was said to know of the contemplated

changes, when asked concerning the story, said:

"I do not know that Judge Grosscup has any intention of resigning, but I do know that Mr. Calhoun stands high with the authorities at Washington."

Mr. Calhoun said:

"I have heard rumors for some time that Judge Grosscup was going to resign, but whether he has done so or not I do not know. I have no information as to what would be done in case he should resign, and I have not been consulted as to whether I would be appointed to fill such a vacancy."

Judge Grosscup rendered the decision annulling the fine of \$29,240,000 imposed on the Standard Oil Company.

OREGON PEARS BRING HIGH PRICE

Comice pears from the Bear Creek orchard on the outskirts of Medford were recently sold in London by W. Dennis & Son for 21 shillings a half box, or \$10.98 a box.

This figure breaks all previous records for prices paid for pears, surpassing by \$1.88 the former record of these famous trees of \$9.20 per box. A high mark has now been set and it may be some time before it is again surpassed.

The pears were part of a shipment made by Manager Whisler of the Bear Creek Orchard Company to Rae & Hatfield, of New York. These fruit brokers reshipped a lot to London and received the fabulous price of \$10.98 a box—Medford Tribune.
