VETERINARY SURGEONS
IN CIRCUIT COURT

Dr. Weller Seeks to Enjoin Dr. Christie From Practicing in Lane County

Byron M. Weller, a veterinary surgeon of this city, has begun suit in the circuit court against Dr. J. Christie, another veterinarian, to enjoin the latter from practicing his profession in this county. The plaintiff alleges in his complaint that in September, 1925, he and one Dr. Hanson, bought Dr. Christie's practice in Lane county and the latter agreed at the time of the sale to cease practicing in this county during the remainder of his natural life. Weller alleges that since that time Christie has been practicing his profession here in violation of his agreement and asks the court to restrain him from doing so. F. M. DeNeff is attorney for Weller.
