If You Did Clark University
Man Wants to Know
About It

"Have you ever thought of committing suicide? If so, under what circumstances and by what method? What inclined you to one method rather than another? Why did you not do it?"

Such is one lot of the questions asked of the people of the United States by Y. Nakamura, a Clark University student. Little slips of paper have been sent out all over the United States with this and five other groups of questions for the purpose of investigation.

Dr. H. D. Sheldon, of the department of philosophy and education at the University of Oregon, has distributed the slips to his classes. The other questions are:

2. Please state your age, sex, nationality and profession; age at time you thought of committing suicide; your physical condition; any points of heredity; that you know; your economic circumstances, social and family relations; moral and religious life and friendships; were you in the habit of using stimulants either regularly or as occasional indulgence?

3. Did you reflect upon the probable effects upon your friends, father, mother, brother, sister, child, sweetheart, relatives, schoolmates, etc.? Did you think about funeral or burial, about your corpse, etc.? What? Did you feel it your duty,

DEADWOOD ITEMS

(Special Correspondence.)

Deadwood, Jan. 28.—We had quite another snow storm last Thursday night and Friday, snow falling to a depth of six and one-half inches, and there is quite a lot of it left yet.

The highest water we have had this winter was last week, which was fine for those who had sawlogs in the creek.

The first log driving on Lake creek was tried by George Taylor's logging crew.

L. Hunzicker had a crew of men driving also. They seem to think they can drive successfully. C. Wilcutt, of Deadwood, came very near being drowned the 22d. He was bringing a boat down the creek with the tools for the men, when at Hollo's creek he struck a large boulder, which tore a hole in the bow; also the boat turned over, throwing him out. He was helped ashore about a quarter of a mile below, quite exhausted. The tools have not been found yet.

Mrs. Annie Wilcutt, of Deadwood, has gone to Florence to prove up on a timber claim. L. Hunzicker, Alex Power and C. Wilcutt are the witnesses.

J. A. Burnett, of this place, is looking after Mr. Powers' ranch while he is at Florence.

One of the hardest wind storms we have ever had was Sunday and Tuesday. It blew quite a lot of timber in the road; also putting the telephone lines out of commission. They are being repaired as fast as possible.

Taylor's logging camp expects to be through logging at H. Steinhauer's in about three weeks if the weather will permit.

The salmon hatchery at this place has hatched out about one hundred thousand young salmon already and have lots more eggs to hatch.

The salmon run was light this fall, owing to the fishermen giving them no chance to get to their spawning ground.
