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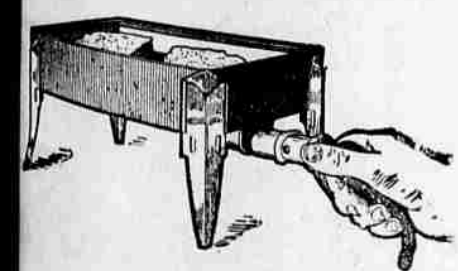

McMINNVILLE MEN FINED FOR LIQUOR SELLING

McMinnville, Feb. 4.—Deputy District Attorney Conner was called to Carlton today to finish up in the justice court a batch of prosecutions for violation of the county prohibition law. Dr. A. D. Morrison, a druggist, was convicted on three counts, and fined aggregating \$550 and 30 days' imprisonment in the county jail were imposed.

James L. Fawcett, proprietor of a near-beer joint, was convicted on three charges and for the several offenses was fined a total of \$150 and 20 days in the county jail. His bartender, Philip Mullen, was convicted on three separate counts and sentenced to pay fines aggregating \$200 and 20 days' imprisonment. All three of the defendants filed notice of appeal to the circuit court, which meets here the third Monday in March.
