DRAWING NEAR TO CLOSE

A popular voting contest is rapidly drawing to a close. The contest is for the selection of the most representative art collection ever seen in one place upon this continent. At the foot of lofty trees which have never bowed their heads to the splendor or beauty of anything else upon this earth there will be placed the paintings of men whose brushes are still hallowed although their canvases are as old as the hearts of the trees themselves.

This collection of pictures will be the art exhibit of the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition, to be held in Seattle beginning with the first of next June and the place will be a permanent building upon grounds hewn out of a virgin fir forest in the outskirts of the city—a forest saved from the hands of the commercial lumberman because of the fact that it is the property of the state of Washington and held in trust for the State University.

The collection of pictures will not undertake to compete with the collections gathered in any of the great galleries of the world or even with the collections gathered by the art directors of the Columbian Exposition in Chicago or the Louisiana Purchase Exposition in St. Louis. With these two exceptions however, it will be the most remarkable of any of the World's Fairs in the country and will far outshine any other exhibition of art in this country because of the limitations placed upon it and the instructions given to the men who are now in the field collecting the pictures which will form it.

Once in Seattle the paintings and bronzes—for the collection will include no marble statuary—will be included in the collection.

NEW FREIGHT RATE

HITS PRUNE SHIPPER

Smaller Grades Forced From Market, Except Locally—Gile Explains the Disadvantages.

Salem, Or., Feb. 6.—An idea of the effect of the advanced rates upon freight for eastern shipment upon the prune and general fruit industry of the state of Oregon is shown by a communication to the railroad commission for the U. S. Gile company, commission merchants of this city, received today. According to Mr. Gile's statement, the advance practically puts the smaller sizes of the Oregon French prunes out of the market, except for local consumption. As an example, Mr. Gile refers to an order received for the shipment of a carload of French or Petite prunes, size 100-120s, at 1 1/2c per pound f. o. b. Cleveland, O. Mr. Gile points out that the cost of boxing the fruit is 37 1/2 cents, which would leave but \$1.12 1/2 for the fruit, cost of handling and selling included. He says he tried to get 1 1/2 cents, but failed because the broker explained it would be impossible on account of the advance in rates.
