HAMPTON'S NEW STORE TO OPEN ON FEBRUARY 25

All Arrangements Made for Beginning Business At Cottage Grove

Alton Hampton, of the firm of Hampton Brothers, Eugene, was in Cottage Grove Monday, accompanied by his brother-in-law, G. H. Tyson, who will serve as manager of the company's branch dry goods store, which will be opened in the Phillips brick in this city about February 25. Dunbar & O'Loane having granted them a few days' extension of time in which to vacate the building, Mr. Hampton and Mr. Tyson expressed themselves as being most favorably impressed with Cottage Grove, but think that we should endeavor to pave at least our main street from the depot to the river as soon as possible. Mr. Hampton stating that he stood ready and willing to contribute liberally to a fund to be used for this purpose at once. The Cottage Grove firm will be styled "Hampton Bros. & Co., G. H. Tyson, manager." The latter named gentleman has leased a home in this city and will soon take up his permanent abode here.

More Sawmills
The Alca, Douglas county, sawmill, which was recently sold to Stock & Hankins, of this city, by J. H. Chambers, and for which a mill site was wanted in Cottage Grove, will be moved up on the tract of timber owned by Messrs. Stocks & Hankins on the O. & S. E. railroad in Row river valley, about ten miles east of Cottage Grove and will be ready for operation by the time spring opens. The mill will be located near the Sid Vaughn place, and will add to the many sawmill industries along the line of the Cottage Grove-Bohemian mines railroad.—Leader.

FLORENCE HIGH HAS YOUNGEST HIGH SCHOOL SOPHOMORE IN OREGON

Lewis Bond, a student in the Florence high school, thought to be the youngest high school student in Oregon, and if not the youngest, at least the sophomore or second year student with the least number of years and months on his shoulders. Two years ago he was the youngest student to pass the eighth grade examination in the state. He was then ten, and is now twelve. His father is Rev. L. R. Bond of Florence. He has three brothers in Eugene, Paul, a teacher in the Eugene high school, and Jesse and Aubrey, University students.

SENATE FROWNS ON HIGH SCHOOL FRATS

Salem, Or., Feb. 9.—At last night's session the senate passed the bill introduced by Senator Cole abolishing fraternities, sororities and other secret societies among students in the public schools of this state, including high schools. Seventeen senators voted for it. It was favorably reported by the education committee, consisting of Senators Cole, Miller, Johnson, Abraham and Selling. The law will not touch the University or the agricultural college.

Cole, in behalf of his measure, said secret societies among the younger students were accompanied by many evils, chief among which was the inculcation of snobbishness and an aristocracy that was undesirable in high schools.

Selling took the stand that such organizations were undemocratic and un-American, and therefore should be abolished.

Hedges spoke against the measure, taking the stand that the secret societies were uplifting and stood for the highest in school life.
