

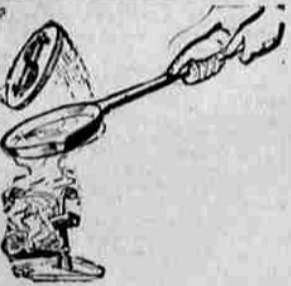

LEGISLATURE WILL SPEND \$4,000,000

General Appropriation Bill Will Carry Over Three Million Dollars

State Capitol, Salem, Or., Feb. 12. The make-up of the legislative budget as far as it has proceeded indicates that appropriations will reach \$3,708,925, including standing appropriations.

The ways and means committee of the house today introduced a general bill appropriating \$1,547,080. This is \$279,510 more than the same bill two years ago. It provides for running expenses and salaries of state departments, and institutions.

Yesterday the committee introduced a deficiency bill for \$104,266.83, or \$52,385.87 more than two years ago. The big items of increase in the deficiency bill are for supreme court emoluments, institution for the feeble-minded, and the capitol building.

The following appropriations have passed both houses:
Experiment station at Hermiston, \$6900.
Coast salmon hatcheries, \$20,000.

Columbia River hatcheries, \$1200. Besides these the house has appropriated for topographic surveys \$30,000, and Snake river improvements, \$15,000.

The house committee on ways and means will recommend \$25,000 for Indian fighters of 1855.

Bills Favored by House

Appropriation bills favorably reported in the house by the committee are:
Crater Lake road, \$100,000; scalp bounty, \$40,000; Drain normal, \$12,000; Portage road, \$75,000; dairy inspector, \$1200; veterinarian, \$2,000.
Other bills reported by the ways and means committee are:
Improvements to asylum, \$262,000; Agricultural College, \$450,000; deaf mute school, \$75,000; Month Normal, \$106,000; Weston, \$106,000; Ashland, \$106,000; agricultural fairs, \$7000.
Total increase, \$750,000.
In addition are standing appropriations for about \$500,000. The total of all the foregoing items is \$3,615,035.
This does not include \$200,000 proposed for an Eastern Oregon asylum nor a multitude of other appropriations which will be sought after, each small in amount. The total of appropriations two years ago was \$2,058,574. The increase this session promises to be close to \$1,600,000.

Taft Says Lock Canal is Right

Also Predicts That the Great Work Will Be Completed in 1914

New Orleans, Feb. 12.—President-elect W. H. Taft landed here shortly before 3 o'clock this afternoon from Panama and was enthusiastically received. He will be the city's guest until Saturday morning. Mr. Taft made a brief speech this afternoon, heartily approving the lock system of canal across the isthmus.

Mr. Taft received by wireless telegraph yesterday the news of the constitutional question raised against the appointment of Senator Knox as secretary of state. He was somewhat disturbed over the situation last night, but early today he received the news of the disposition of congress to amend the cabinet salary law and was inclined to take this as a happy solution of the difficulty.

Finish Canal by 1915

On the trip from Panama Mr. Taft made the first draft of his inaugural address. This he intends to submit

to certain friends in Washington next week.
In his address here today Mr. Taft made what he said was his summing up of his trip.

"I am here on my way from a great constructive work," he said, "the greatest entered into by any nation during the present two centuries, and I am glad to say that the work is going on as you would have it go on, that on the first of January, 1915, at least, if not before—and I am very much interested in having it in the next four years—that canal will be completed. And when that time comes you will see floating down this river your great commerce, bound through these straits to the west coast of South America, to the Orient and to Australia.
