KEEL PLATE OF BATTLESHIP LAID

Camden, N. J., Feb. 23.—The keel plate of the new first-class battleship Utah, which is to be the equal of any fighting ship in the world, was laid at the Camden yards of the New York Shipbuilding Company today. There was little ceremony, but the group of naval constructors and shipbuilders who stood with bared heads as the finitely welded steel plate was adjusted seemed to feel that this was no ordinary keel-laying.

The Utah is one of the great battleships for which an appropriation was made by congress last year. She will be of the Dreadnaught class, but superior in many respects, it is said, to her prototype in the British navy. It is asserted that the builders mean to establish a new record for the completion of this giant craft. If their predictions are fulfilled the Utah will be in readiness for her initial dip into the Delaware on January 1, 1910.
